## **Background**

The purpose of this contract is to procure dairy products to feed inmates and residents residing in the DOCR facilities. The DOCR has been working on an RFP to solicit all categories of food and supplies to operate three kitchens. Dairy Maid has been the only supplier that can provide goods with the sizing, packaging, nutritional requirements, and delivery schedule that meets the DOCR needs. The RFP and the renewal of the Dairy Maid's contract were delayed due to the DOCR Contract Administrator's extended leave of absence. The DOCR plans to issue the RFP in January of 2025 and request to have the Dairy Maid contract reinstated and extended for one year (1) with a ten (10) day kick-out clause.

Dairy Maid Dairy, LLC. Is continues to be a responsible service provider and their prices remain fair and reasonable. The estimated annual value of this contract is \$100.000.00.
