Background

This will not be a procurement contract. OHR requests that the CRC recommend the CAO waiver of the Montgomery County Procurement Regulations, as permitted under Procurement Regulations §1.1.2, for OHR's use of recruitment subscription services. OHR plans to explore the legislative process for the use of recruitment subscription services as an exemption from Procurement Law and Regulations.

Background

The referenced Contractor provides youth development and social and mental health services to Northwood High School based Wellness Center. The third extension beyond the term of this contract was a result of a large number of solicitations needing completion at the same time and were delayed by the RFP process. HHS issued an RFP for these services on February 15, 2024 and received approval from Procurement to start contract negotiations with the awardee on May 9, 2024. HHS anticipates concluding the contract negotiations by the end of this month and have a new contract in place effective August 1, 2024. Northwood High School Wellness Center will be renovated by Montgomery County Public Schools in June and the existing Contractor NCCF will need to move out of the building by June 15th (contract expires June 30, 2024). The new site, Woodward, will be open August 1, 2024, so the new awardee from the RFP will start program services at the new location effective August 1, 2024. Therefore, HHS would like to request a one-month no cost extension beyond the term from July 1-July 31, 2024 to allow sufficient time for the completion of the solicitation process and a transition plan between the new awardee and NCCF.

Motion

Robert Norris moved to approve the extension beyond the term with The National Center for Children and Families, contract #1059622, for 1 month at no cost. This is in accordance with Procurement Regulation, 4.1.12.3(a)(2). Chris Mullin seconded the motion. The motion was unanimously approved.
