<u>Bill 18-22 Noise Control – Leaf Removal Equipment – Amendments-</u>

This Bill 18-22 Noise Control-Leaf Removal Equipment was discussed during the T&E Committee work session on February 13, 2023, Councilmember Marilyn Balcombe presented an amendment to permit the use of gasoline blowers for farming uses and agricultural producers. On March 7, 2023, the Full Council voted unanimously to support the amendment to exempt agricultural producers from this Bill 18-22. The Bill 18-22 was scheduled for final reading for a second time on March 21, 2023.

Recommendations:

28. To add diversity to the Committee while continuing to give commodity farmers a strong voice, the County Council should revise the membership criteria in Section 49-80 as follows:

Membership. The County Executive must appoint, subject to confirmation by the County Council, a Rustic Roads Advisory Committee. In making appointments, the Executive should strive to achieve diversity on the Committee in support of racial equity and social justice. The Committee has nine voting members. Each member must be a resident of the County. The Executive should appoint:

- three members who operate commercial farmland earning 50 percent or more of their income from farming;
- one member who is a representative of the Agricultural Advisory Committee and has been recommended to the Executive by the AAC;
- one member who knows rural preservation techniques through practical experience and training;
- (4) one member who knows roadway engineering through practical experience and training;
- (5) three at-large members to be drawn from other users of rustic roads. Examples of the at-large members include, but are not limited to: a table crop farmer who does not earn more than 50 percent of their income from farming; an expert in tourism or historic sites along the roads; a member of a religious institution on a rustic road; an operator of an agritourism business, such as a winery, brewery, farm stand, or recreation or entertainment venue on a rustic road; or a person who regularly uses the roads to engage in or reach places for outdoor recreation, such as to bike, boat, kayak, hike, fish, ride horses, or go birding.

The Administration has not processed an announcement like the one that is attached for AAC appointments for over two years. Moving forward, this outcome of delaying will result in all 15 AAC members will need action taken annually on the status of their appointments. This outcome is in conflict with the County Code Chapter 2B as outlined below where the AAC appointments are supposed to be staggered so that only 1/3 of the AAC members would need action taken annually.

Sec. 2B-21. Agricultural Advisory Committee.

(h) *Staff.* The Chief Administrative Officer must provide appropriate staff to the Committee. (2009 L.M.C., ch. 26, § 1; 2010 L.M.C., ch. 49, § 1; 2015 L.M.C., ch. 36, § 1.)

Editor's note—2009 L.M.C., ch. 26, § 2, states: Transition. Section 2B-21, as added by Sec. 1 of this Act, establishes an Agricultural Advisory Committee. This Committee continues the Agricultural Advisory Committee created under Council Resolution 7-1138 and restructured under Council Resolution 8-705. The County Executive may reappoint, subject to Council confirmation, the members of the Agricultural Advisory Committee. The Executive should continue to stagger the terms of the members of the Agricultural Advisory Committee so that approximately one-third of the terms continue to expire each year.
