# <u>Bill 40-21- Individual Water Supply and Sewage Disposal Systems - Amendments</u> (McCartney-Green)

During the October 24, 2022, Transportation and Environment Committee work session several questions were raised that DEP staff did not have all the information. We are monitoring the County Council for another T&E Committee work session to be scheduled.

#### Bill 18-22 Noise Control – Leaf Removal Equipment – Amendments-

This Bill 18-22 Noise Control-Leaf Removal Equipment was introduced on June 21, 2022, and the Public Hearing was on September 20, 2022. Some of the agricultural groups remitted letters to the County Council opposing the Bill 18-22 which prohibits gasoline leaf blowers. The T&E Committee

work session was held on February 13, 2023, and Councilmember Marilyn Balcombe presented an amendment to permit the use of gasoline blowers in the Agricultural Reserve. We are hopeful the actual language for this amendment will be available for the next work session.
