I have read over the staff memo that Jessica provided and took some notes on the Diverse and Adaptable Growth Section.

The Thrive 2050 staff memo covers many topics that will be in conflict with some of the goals of the Agricultural Community. In the document, the staff lay out what the trends in the County will be heading towards 2050 these include:

- Sluggish economic growth and a decrease in the median wage since 2007
- Diverse population but not diverse neighborhoods
- Aging population without an increase in younger workers this leads to a lower average household income
- Housing and living costs increasing without an increase in wages, making affordable housing important
- Development in the past was car oriented
- The County is built out, new building will be redevelopment with a focus on mixed used housing

These factors will make it a challenge to find new ways to utilize TDR's and BLT's if a new focus is not placed on them.




- This section is big on urbanism and walkable living being able to walk/ride a bike/ easier commuter services nearby and how the County at larger can be designed to live this way.
