- 2. Standing Agency Updates
 - Circuit Court (Judge Bonifant)
 - o Open Pending Criminal Matters: 911 as of 6/30/2025
 - Open Pending Juvenile Cases: 189 as of 6/30/2025
 - District Court (Judge Koch)
 - o Recent 1st graduation of DUI Court Class
 - o Currently working on a Veterans Court proposal
 - Mental Health Court going well
 - Lots of changes happening to attempt to divert folks before arrest or charging, working with Public Defenders office and State's Attorney's office.
 - MCPD (Chief Yamada, Asst. Chief McBain, and Asst. Chief Francke)
 - Current focus: Pedestrian Safety concerns (we've had several recent incidents)
 - Asst Chief McBain noted the Summer DUI enforcement (in collaboration with State and Local law enforcement partners) have made 127 arrested since starting in late May and noted 8 DUIs arrested just at the 1 checkpoint new Downtown Crown/I-370.
 - Dr. Bridgers (Director, DHHS) noted the current trend of Intoxication Fatalities by Selected Substances (year to date)
 - Fentanyl remains the primary driver of overdose mortality in Montgomery County
 - 32 fatal overdoses in Montgomery County during the first 6 months of 2025 including 21 cases involving opiates, 20 cases involving fentanyl, 5 involving Heroin, 3 involving Rx opioids, 12 involving cocaine and 11 involving alcohol.
 - Montgomery County saw a decrease of 24%
 (10 fewer cases) in fatal overdoses during
 2025, a decrease of 34% for fatal overdoses

- involving opioids, 29% decrease for fatal overdoses involving Fentanyl, a decline of 31% for fatal overdoses involving alcohol
- MCPD along with other County Partners are actively engaged in a pilot Intervention Plan (in the Wheaton area) to support the Latino males in the community who are disproportionately affected by Alcohol use in DUI arrests and collisions/pedestrian fatalities
 - Monica Martin (Chief, Behavioral Health & Crisis Services, DHHS) noted they are focused on a communications campaign thru the Latino Health Initiative, and are starting a Group Education meeting every other Wed (7/30/2025 6:30-8pm) to increase families/caregivers' knowledge of the impact of alcohol use, cycle of addition and what resources are available for concerned family members
- No alarming trends in crime currently; Auto thefts and thefts of auto parts on-going
- While there have been several different protest events, they have been peaceful and Commanders have been addressing
- State's Attorney (John McCarthy)
 - Highlighted National Night Out coming up on Tues. Aug 5 (4-9pm) around the County; free family-friendly events that welcome local first responders and the community to come together with a focus on public safety begins with you!
 - Highlighted a recent victory in which MCPD was instrumental in the conviction of a former FBI agent who was found guilty of rape and other offenses.
 - o Thanked Sean Mukherjee for the continued partnership
 - The Banner is coming to MoCo which will provide a greater spotlight on the work Montgomery County is doing
 - Excited for Tara Jackson, the new Prince George's County State's Attorney
 - o Chief McSwain will be missed, best wishes on his retirement
- During the Standing Agency Updates it was noted that the Circuit Court is down 2 judges and the Office of the Public Defender is down 3 attorneys. A comment was made that OPD was not permitted to fill their open positions—This is a State Executive Branch decision, not a local County Executive Branch decision.
- 3. Briefing: MCPD Technology Capt. Nick Picerno,
 Montgomery County Police Department

• Real-Time Intelligence (Crime) Center (RTIC)

- o Provides Officers with information from a centralized location
- o Access to over 4,000 cameras including Private (Businesses/HOAs) and Public (personal home cameras that have been registered by the homeowner)
 - Montgomery County Residents can register their own home cameras by visiting: https://mococonnect.org/
 - MCPD currently working on a grant which would provide cameras to faith based facilities
- Allows better sharing of data between local jurisdictions (Prince Georges, DC) in Real Time

• Drone as First Responder (DFR)

- O Provide air support to 911 or police generated calls for service, launching on avg under 1 min (1st on Scene).
 - Provides real time information to ground officers on location of subject(s), while officers are in route
- Montgomery County is the 1st Major City and Largest Jurisdiction in Maryland with this program
- Montgomery County currently has 4 launch sites (Bethesda, Gaithersburg/Montgomery Village, Silver Spring, and Wheaton) with plans to add a site in Germantown and White Oak
- o Future Upgrade Drone 2.0 Skydio
 - This all-in-one system can be placed in any location, and launched from that spot no longer a need for a roof pilot as is required for the current Drone operation

• Automated License Plate Readers (ALPR)

 Mobile readers are in Police Cruisers, Stationary Readers would be placed on major roadways into the County with the object of detecting stolen vehicles/preventing future thefts in garages

4. Briefing: Retail Theft

Assistant Chief Darren Francke Montgomery County Police Department

- Many retailers have a no confrontation policy when it comes to Shoplifters which MCPD understands; the key is education, communication and connection
- Montgomery County uses technology (RTIC, DFRs, ALPRs) and connections to the Community and the businesses (ground officers/Commanders) to deter retail theft
 - O 3D as an example has made great strides with several businesses in their community to combat the Shoplifting by educating the retailers on environmental design changes they can make to deter shoplifting
 - o Pike & Rose (Federal Realty) has been a key partner, taking active steps with their retailers to address Shoplifting before it starts it would be interesting to see if we could illustrate the fiscal impact of this type of prevention to provide to other property owners, mom and pop shops etc.

- Montgomery County (MCPD) will take Shoplifters to Central Processing (unlike other jurisdictions)
- MD Retailers Alliance spoke about being encouraged by the new Organized Retail Theft Act of 2025 which goes into effect October 1, 2025 -allows Counties to aggregate the amount an individual or organized group stole and allows for prosecution to take place within any of the Counties affected.

 - identify the appropriate amount of resources the County needs or should provide regarding the reopening of Noyes
 - identify the collaboration opportunities
 - provide a recommendation to the full CJCC by Nov. 19th 2025 (last CJCC meeting of the year) so it could be shared ahead of any State or County Budget discussions for Fiscal Year 2027
- A suggestion was made to potentially have SAO (Carlotta Woodward) and DHHS lead this effort
- At the time of the discussion, several members of the CJCC had left, therefore we no longer had quorum, so no vote was possible. The Steering Committee will discuss how in which to move forward to a vote before the next meeting (in keeping with the Open Meetings Act).


*DFR is used to fly to and from 911 and police generated calls for service. The goals of the DFR program are to improve response times, increase efficiency, increase and assist with de-escalation, and provide real time information to responding officers about the emergency call.

*Raven 2 covers the 2nd District (Bethesda), Raven 3 covers the 3rd District (Silver Spring), and Raven 4 covers the 4th District (Wheaton). These three sites have a 1.2 NM flight radius. Raven 6 covers the 6th District (Gaithersburg/Montgomery Village) and has a 2.5 NM flight radius.


