Gabe Albornoz

Gabe was appointed Director of Montgomery County Recreation by County Executive Marc Elrich in December 2025, marking his return to the role after serving seven years on the County Council. A lifelong resident of the County, Albornoz has more than two decades of experience in public service, policy leadership and operational management. He previously led Montgomery County Recreation from 2007 to 2018, becoming the youngest person in County history to hold the position.

Under his leadership, the department earned 83 national and state awards for excellence. He also oversaw 11 capital projects totaling more than \$280 million, including the construction of five new community recreation centers and the renovation of six others. From 2018 to 2025, Gabe served as an at-Large County Councilmember. He served as Council President in 2021 and chaired the Health and Human Services Committee. His legislative accomplishments include establishing the Intellectual and Developmental Disabilities Commission, helping launch the MoCo BOOST Guaranteed Income Program, and spearheading efforts to achieve high vaccination rates in the Latino community during the COVID-19 pandemic through the creation of Por Nuestra Salud y Bienestar.

Gabe is bilingual in English and Spanish. A graduate of Montgomery County Public Schools (Walt Whitman High School), Albornoz has earned a Bachelor of Arts in Communication from the University of Maryland and an MBA from Johns Hopkins University. He resides in Kensington with his wife and four children.
