PURPOSE: Review Executive's recommendation and make recommendation to the Council

This Committee session will review and make recommendations for a new project: **Burtonsville Crossing Shopping Center**.

I. Discussion of New Project: Burtonsville Crossing Shopping Center

This project provides for the supplemental appropriation of \$5,000,000 of State Aid in FY23 and programs an additional \$2,000,000 in FY24. Senate Bill 291 approved grants totaling \$7,000,000 by the State of Maryland for the acquisition, design, planning, engineering, construction, repair, renovation, reconstruction, and site improvement at the Burtonsville Crossing Shopping Center, located at 15179 Old Columbia Pike in Burtonsville.

The funding for this project will be administered by DGS, which will receive requests for reimbursements from the developer (EDENS) for improvements made at the shopping center. DGS is developing internal processes and controls to monitor the administration of this funding.

Table 1 below details the recommended FY23-28 CIP expenditure schedule for this project.

More specifically, legislative language contained in SB 291 provides for the following uses in FY23:

- \$3,5000,000 for the acquisition, design, planning, engineering, construction, repair, renovation, reconstruction, site improvement, and any costs associated with extinguishing a lease restriction at the Burtonsville Crossing Shopping Center; and
- \$1,500,000 for acquisition, planning, design, construction, repair, renovation, reconstruction, site improvement, and capital equipping of the Burtonsville Crossing Shopping Center.

Construction is currently underway with the opening of a farmers' market on the site expected in late 2023; see here for more details: https://edens.com/property/burtonsville-crossing/.

I am recommending a supplemental appropriation to the FY23 Capital Budget and an amendment to the FY23-28 Capital Improvements Program (CIP) in the amount of \$5,000,000 for Burtonsville Crossing Shopping Center (No. 362311). Appropriation for this project will fund capital improvements to support redevelopment in the Burtonsville area.

This increase is needed because Senate Bill 291 approved grants totaling \$5,000,000 by the State of Maryland for the acquisition, design, planning, engineering, construction, repair, renovation, reconstruction, and site improvement at the Burtonsville Crossing Shopping Center, located at 15179 Old Columbia Pike in Burtonsville.

The recommended amendment is consistent with the criteria for amending the CIP because it leverages significant State aid and supports economic development. The project supports the redevelopment of retail properties to contribute to the tax base and employment in Montgomery County.

I recommend that the County Council approve this supplemental appropriation and an amendment to the FY23-28 Capital Improvements Program in the amount of \$5,000,000 and specify the source of funds as State aid.

Background

- 1. Section 307 of the Montgomery County Charter provides that any supplemental appropriation shall be recommended by the County Executive who shall specify the source of funds to finance it. The Council shall hold a public hearing on each proposed supplemental appropriation after at least one week's notice. A supplemental appropriation that would comply with, avail the County of, or put into effect a grant or a Federal, State or County law or regulation, or one that is approved after January 1 of any fiscal year, requires an affirmative vote of six Councilmembers. A supplemental appropriation for any other purpose that is approved before January 1 of any fiscal year requires an affirmative vote of seven Councilmembers. The Council may, in a single action, approve more than one supplemental appropriation. The Executive may disapprove or reduce a supplemental appropriation, and the Council may reapprove the appropriation, as if it were an item in the annual budget.
- 2. Section 302 of the Montgomery County Charter provides that the Council may amend an approved capital improvements program at any time by an affirmative vote of no fewer than six members of the Council.
- 3. The County Executive recommends the following capital project appropriation increases:

PROJECT DESCRIPTION

Maryland Senate Bill 291 approved grants totaling \$5,000,000 by the State of Maryland to support the acquisition, design, planning, engineering, construction, repair, renovation, reconstruction, and site improvement of the property at the Burtonsville Crossing Shopping Center. Burtonsville Crossing is an existing, largely vacant shopping center constructed circa 1988 and consists of approximately 130,000 SF of commercial space on approximately 12 acres. The project aims to revitalize the property through its renovation and re-tenanting.

The overall project scope to be undertaken by the shopping center owners, includes the following: architecturally renovated building facades and breezeways; the interior fitout and exterior facade of a new grocery store anchor; structural repairs and upgrades to the existing buildings; replacement of HVAC equipment; new roof; refurbished parking lot; refreshed and enhanced landscaping and additional trees; improved site and common area lighting and LED retrofit; demolition of approximately 7,000 square feet of the building at the center of the property; construction of a new community space and green with pedestrian connectivity to the park-and-ride and Bus Rapid Transit station at the rear of the property; and sitework to create two pads for future new buildings.

ESTIMATED SCHEDULE

Project implementation to begin in FY23.

COST CHANGE

Scope increased to recognize additional state support for project implementation awarded during the 2023 Maryland General Assembly session.

PROJECT JUSTIFICATION

The project leverages significant State aid and supports economic development of the Burtonsville area. The project supports the redevelopment of retail properties to contribute to the tax base and to employment in Montgomery County.

FISCAL NOTE

FY23 supplemental in State Aid for the amount of \$5,000,000.
