# **DESCRIPTION/ISSUE**

The COVID-19 public health crisis has closed non-essential businesses leaving many county residents with no or significantly reduced income and facing extreme financial hardship. The Federal Government has awarded additional Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) and Emergency Solutions Grant (ESG) funding in response to the emergency as a part of the CARES Act.

### **SUMMARY OF KEY DISCUSSION POINTS**

The County Executive recommends that the CDBG funding (\$2,955,102) be used to provide rental
assistance to low-income County residents and small business assistance to low-income owners
of micro-enterprises, and the ESG funding (\$1,438,797) for temporary shelter and rapid rehousing assistance to people experiencing homelessness because of the current public health
emergency.

HUD requires that this funding be utilized to reduce the negative impact of COVID-19.

This funding will be utilized to provide financial support for County residents and businesses currently facing hardships resulting from the COVID-19 crisis. Specifically, funds will be used to provide rental assistance to low-income county residents, small business assistance to low-income owners of micro-enterprises, and temporary shelter and rapid rehousing to reduce the growing numbers of people experiencing homelessness due to the effects of the COVID-19 emergency.

I recommend that the County Council approve this special appropriation in the amount of \$4,393,899 and specify the source of funds as Grant Fund. This special appropriation does not impact General Fund Reserves.

## **Background**

- 1. Section 308 of the County Charter provides that a special appropriation is an appropriation which states that it is necessary to meet an unforeseen disaster or other emergency, or to act without delay in the public interest. Each special appropriation shall be approved by not less than six Councilmembers. The Council may approve a special appropriation at any time after public notice by news release. Each special appropriation shall specify the source of funds to finance it.
- 2. The Department of Housing and Community Affairs administers three federal Community Planning and Development (CPD) grants funded through the Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD). Through the federal Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act, HUD is providing the County with \$4,393,899 in funding through two such CPD grants, including the Community Development Block Grant COVID-19 (CDBG-CV) funded at \$2,955,102, and Emergency Solution Grant COVID-19 (ESG-CV) funded at \$1,438,797. HUD requires that this funding be utilized to reduce the negative impact of COVID-19.
- 3. This funding will be utilized to provide financial support for County residents and businesses currently facing hardships resulting from the COVID-19 crisis. Specifically, funds will be used to provide rental assistance to low-income county residents, small business assistance to low-income owners of micro-enterprises, and temporary shelter and rapid rehousing to reduce the growing numbers of people experiencing homelessness due to the effects of the COVID-19 emergency.
- 4. Notice of a public hearing was given and a public hearing was held.
