COUNCIL DECISION POINTS

The County Council is seeking applicants for the County's 11-member Commission on Redistricting. The positions must be filled by February 1, 2021

DESCRIPTION/ISSUE

The Montgomery County Charter, as amended by the voters in the 2020 general election, states that the County shall be divided into seven Council districts for the purpose of nominating and electing seven members of the Council. Each district shall be compact in form and be composed of adjoining territory. Prior to the recent election, the Charter required the County to be divided into five Council districts. The new requirement for seven districts will apply to the 2022 election, and the Council will consist of eleven members, with four at-large members.

The Charter also requires that the Council shall appoint a Commission on Redistricting. The Commission shall be composed of 11 registered voters who reside in the County. The Commission shall include at least one but no more than four members of each political party which polled at least 15 percent of the total vote cast for all candidates for the Council in the last preceding regular election. As a result of the 2018 General Election, there are two parties recognized by the State of Maryland: the Democratic Party and the Republican Party. At least one member of the Commission shall reside in each Council district. The commission shall, at its first meeting, select one of its members to serve as its chair. No person who holds any elected office shall be eligible for appointment to the Commission.

Montgomery Council Seeks Applicants for County Commission on Redistricting

Deadline Extended to Tuesday, November 17 at 5 p.m.

ROCKVILLE, Md., Nov. 12, 2020—The Montgomery County Council is seeking applicants for the County's 11-member Commission on Redistricting. The positions must be filled by February 1, 2021. The deadline to apply for consideration is 5 p.m. on Tuesday, November 17, 2020.

The Montgomery County Charter, as amended by the voters in the 2020 general election, states that the County shall be divided into seven Council districts for the purpose of nominating and electing seven members of the Council. Each district shall be compact in form and be composed of adjoining territory. Prior to the recent election, the Charter required the County to be divided into five Council districts. The new requirement for seven districts will apply to the 2022 election, and the Council will consist of eleven members, with four at-large members.

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By November 15, 2021, the Commission shall present a plan of Council districts, together with a report explaining the plan to the Council. Within 30 days after receiving the plan, the Council shall hold a public hearing on it. If within 90 days after presentation of the Commission's plan no other law re-establishing the boundaries of the Council districts has been enacted, then the plan, as submitted, shall become law.

Initially, during the 1998 Asian financial crisis, I was dedicated to advising Central Banks and supervisory agencies on the structure of their bank supervisory and regulatory processes and providing road maps for upgrade and reform therein. Thereafter, I carried this work forward and assisted World Bank client countries in Central Europe on the same during the post-socialist period.

My work continued in this area while later developing and leading a program which evaluated regulatory and financial system governance in selected countries in Central Europe, East Asia, Middle East, and Central America. This program assessed how key financial institutions were governed / overseen by their boards of directors and the surrounding legal and supervisory framework that influenced these structures. This involved, in part, evaluation of meaningful samples of primarily banking institutions' internal management processes, information flows, board appointment and oversight practices, risk management activities, remuneration structure, etc. Road maps and instructions for strengthening were rendered thereafter with hands-on assistance provided on a selected basis.

I participated in training programs and conferences in international forums and played an instrumental role in the Basel Committee's revision of "Enhancing Corporate Governance in Banking Organizations" (2015)1. I also represented the World Bank in the Financial Stability Board's Third Thematic Peer Review on Risk Governance (publ. 2/13)2.

Throughout my tenure at the World Bank, I conducted complex country assessments of compliance with the Basel Core Principles for Banking

Supervision, the primary output which was a deep and holistic reports on a country's banking supervisory and regulatory framework and the condition of the overall banking sector. I provided bank supervision and regulation technical assistance to various World Bank client countries on an ongoing basis.

I began my career with the Office of the Comptroller of the Currency (OCC), the branch of the US Treasury department responsible for the oversight of the national banking system, as a bank supervisor. This included activities such as conducting: licensing examinations, reviews of highly distressed banking organizations, examinations of complex credits and credit portfolios, and evaluations of capital markets and trading activities. During my last 9 years at the OCC, I conducted supervisory examination activities in major U.S. regional and multinational banks primarily in London, New York, and San Francisco, focusing largely on capital markets, funding, trading, and derivatives activities. Over my career, I was assigned to the OCC's Houston, London, New York, and San Francisco offices.

Key skills demonstrated:

The talents I was required to deploy throughout the various activities listed above included: strong analytical skills, ability to plan and strategize project activity approach and execution, collect key information, and draw important conclusions about complex (banking) organizations. Relative to banking, these skills were deployed via evaluating institutional market positions, corporate strategies, policies, procedures, and overall business activity. Observations distilled therein fed into conclusions on how well the subject institution(s) executed business strategy, and conclusions on overall institutional financial soundness, performance, and compliance with law and regulation. The analytical observations and the conclusions drawn at the business and institutional level formed the basis for more complex conclusions I drew about the stability position and condition of the subject country's banking system as a whole.

To the Montgomery County Council:

In response to requests for interest, dated September 25, 2020, I would like to submit my candidacy for the new redistricting commission for Montgomery county council. I am currently a resident of Montgomery County District 1 and a member of the Montgomery County Democratic Party.

I consider the issue of drawing district maps to be critical for the proper functioning of a representative democracy, and I adhere to the concept that voters should choose their representatives; politicians (or those serving in their interests) should not be choosing their own voters. I understand current law requires compact, contiguous districts of (approximately) equal population.

For the League of Women Voters, I have been very active in support of redistricting reform, both at the national level (lobbying in favor of "For the People Act" in both the U.S. Senate and U.S. House of Representatives), and in Maryland in favor of the Fair Maps Act for the Maryland state legislature earlier this year.

My other volunteer "hat" is with the Montgomery County Democratic Party, as Precinct Vice Chair for Rollingwood Precinct (07-005), since 2017, where I have been active in encouraging voter engagement (also elsewhere in the county).

I understand that, no matter the outcome of the ballot questions C&D, there will be a need for drawing new district lines for Montgomery County Council in the wake of the 2020 census. I deeply appreciate the challenge of obtaining sound data following the disruptive effects of the current U.S. administration in attempting to add a question about citizenship in the 2020 census (struck down by the Supreme Court but still having repercussions on people's willingness to participate in the census). These issues are still playing out in court. We may need to be sensitive to the likelihood of undercounts in certain neighborhoods.

CITIZENSHIP QUESTION ON THE CENSUS A CYNICAL ATTEMPT TO MUZZLE IMMIGRANTS' VOICES | OPINION BY KESHIA MORRIS

Like many young black women, I struggle every day to make my voice heard. Despite stereotypes of the "strong black woman," we often are viewed as not sophisticated enough, confident enough. articulate enough — or have not amassed enough money, influence or power — to participate fully in American democracy.

We regularly are told to vote, but for me and millions of others like me, voting is not an option. Although I grew up in South Florida, pay taxes and have been a legal resident of the United States for 17 years, I'm not a citizen. My mother spent many hard years maneuvering through the immigration system, and since I came of age I have continued the effort myself. But citizenship is not easy to obtain.

This means that the census is the one of the only ways my voice counts.

The sad fact is that people of color already are discounted in several ways; gerrymandering and voter suppression tactics, such as strict voter ID laws and a lack of polling places in communities of color, make sure of that. And millions of Americans are still denied the right to vote because of mass criminalization and incarceration. Now, to further weaken the power and voices of people of color, the Trump administration added a citizenship question to the census.

With the administration's anti-immigrant track record, the citizenship question will almost certainly drive down participation among non-citizens and their family members, resulting in huge undercounts and a loss of crucial resources and representation for vulnerable communities.

We now know that was exactly the point.

This month, through litigation challenging North Carolina's blatant partisan gerrymander, Common Cause obtained critical documents revealing that Republican redistricting guru Thomas Hofeller encouraged party and Census Bureau officials to add the citizenship question because it would significantly harm the political power of Latino communities and be "advantageous to Republicans and non-Hispanic whites."

Hofeller's plan was to use a citizenship question to gather data on where non-citizens live, and then manipulate districts to consolidate power for "Republicans and Non-Hispanic Whites" by excluding non-citizens and those under the age of 18 from electoral districts.

But somewhere I read that the census must provide an "actual enumeration" of the nation's population, regardless of citizenship, and that the total count is used to determine representation in Congress. That somewhere is the U.S. Constitution.

Now the accuracy of that "actual enumeration" is in jeopardy because of the citizenship question. Coming from this administration, which has repeatedly stoked American fears to justify actions that divide our country based on race, national origin and religion, the move smacks of an attempt to drive down immigrant participation in the process.

Moreover, the state's U.S. Sen. Rick Scott recently said that, "How many additional congressmen and women that Florida gets, it ought to be based on citizenship." Although that is blatantly unconstitutional, other states have already introduced legislation to divide state districts that exclude non-citizens.

As a practical matter, the census is used to divide all 435 seats in Congress and more than \$800 billion in federal funding among the states. It helps determine the location of hospitals, firehouses, schools, highways and the size of your children's classrooms.

The effects of an undercount will be felt almost everywhere, but especially in states such as Florida, where large numbers of immigrants have settled. Because of that, Florida's congressional delegation — including immigrants and the children of immigrants from both parties — should be working extra hard to remove the citizenship question.

The administration's effort is so egregious that three separate federal courts have ruled that the addition of the citizenship question to the 2020 Census violated the law. Now, it is up to the Supreme Court to act swiftly and decisively to end this blatant abuse of power for partisan political gain. We expect a decision by the end of the month.

By adding a question that is certain to undermine the accurate census count, this administration is discriminating against me and other people of color, while ignoring its duty under the Constitution to count everyone who lives in the United States. It is the obligation of the coequal branches of government — the Congress and the courts — to check this abuse of power by the executive branch.

SCSS provides routines most useful to interactive data analysis. Frequency distribution, n-way crosstabulation, t-test, Pearson correlation, scatter plots, partial correlation, multiple regression, and factor analysis are available.

SCSS master files are direct access variable-ordered files. These master files are not only accessible by many users concurrently, but are fully interfaceable with SPSS system files.

Because SCSS requires on-line data files, it should be restricted to use with small data bases. SCSS will be available to the user community by the summer of 1982.

MODELING .

The Statistical Support Branch (SSB) provides services to the user community in the area of computer modeling. SSB personnel aid the user in performing operations research analysis and technical support necessary to analyze, design, and implement state-of-the art mathematical/statistical computer software models. Techniques such as linear programming, integer programming, dynamic programming regression analysis and factor analysis, whether found in marketed software packages or incorportaed into custom written computer programs are utilized to build the required model.

The following project descriptions are current examples of the types of modeling analysis that SSB is capable of performing for the user community.

1. Teleservice Center Study

The Office of Management, Budget and Personnel (OMBP) is concerned with the efficient operation of SSA's Teleservice Centers (TSC's). These centers allow Social Security beneficiaries to conduct their business by telephone. At present, this network is comprised of 33 facilities and 1600+ employees serving slightly more than one-half of the total population of the United States. OMBP has asked ODS to help them optimize the number and location of prospective TSC's based on the area phone rates (WATS, FX, Local) with the aid of computerized modeling software. After extensive investigation of statistical journals, textbooks, etc., the Statistical Support Branch (SSB) personnel recognized this as a variation of the classic Operation Research location/allocation problem. As a first step, such a model was developed by SSB in PASCAL modeling the Ohio network. Next, the Texas network will be modeled and, if successful, expansion of the model to handle SSA's entire TSC network will be considered.

2. Office of Assessment Work Distribution and Resource Deployment Model

The Office of Assessment (OA) employs a Field Assessment Staff whose primary task is to investigate, for possible error or fraud, cases selected for qualitative review as part of SSA's ongoing Quality Assurance Program. The Field Assessment Staff should be strategically based in several locations throughout the United States so as to minimize travel and operation costs associated with onsite investigation. When asked to aid OA in formulating a deployment procedure, the Statistical Support Branch (SSB) recognized this

arrived and were able to convince him to give up his weapon and leave with them.

New Orleans District Manager Vernon Frye told OASIS: "This office has a buzzer system that the receptionist and several of the supervisors can use to alert the guards in the building when it looks as if a visitor may cause trouble. For example, no interviews are conducted with intoxicated visitors. They are asked to leave. If they create a problem, a guard will escort them to the guard station."

All employees in this office are also trained to alert a supervisor if they hear visitors curse, raise their voices, threaten someone or otherwise become abusive. And they all have the phone number of the guard station

taped on their phones.

In some offices, such as the Birmingham (Dwtn.), Ala., DO, the receptionist sits behind a wall with an opening through which she speaks to the public. For visitors to enter the main area, someone inside has to open the locked door. And still other offices are experimenting with further ways of protecting employees and the public from irrational visitors. In August, the Dallas RO's Training Staff added a lesson plan on "Dealing with Hostile Claimants" to its training package for new receptionists. The information it contains is also appropriate for all interviews.

Donna Craven, Security Officer, San Francisco Regional Office, says that in view of SSA's continuing disability investigations, and the number of people who have been upset by them, it's a tribute to Social Security interviewers that the number of incidents occurring has remained relatively small. "Some people are just waiting for something to set them off. In most cases, the interviewers have avoided confrontations by handling them in a professional, unthreatening manner."

Ever feel that a computer program could help you do a certain job faster and easier if only you knew how to arrange your work to take advantage of one? Curious about what computer services are available at SSA and if any could be tailored to your particular needs? If you answered "yes" to either quiestion, the Office of System Integration's Statistical Support Branch (SSB) may be able to serve you.

Since its creation 3 years ago, the branch has recruited operations research and computer systems analysts who have been helping various components automate tasks that

saving time and money. "At first glance," pointed out Branch Chief George Gluck, "the application of data processing techniques to some work might not seem feasible to many people. But jobs that seemed

too large for computers to francie in the past, and those in which collecting data seemed too involved, can often be handled now with little or no difficulty because of recent developments in programing and com-

For example, before

For example, before a new teleservice center is opened, SSB helps the Office of Management, Budget, and Personnel find what combination of WATS and Foreign Exchange telephone lines is needed. The idea is to get the lowest possible phone bills for TSCs offering toll-free long distance dialing to the public. Along the same lines, the Office of Assessment, out to minimize the travel required of its Field Assessment staff, had SSB come up with the best locations for a number of its field offices. The list doesn't stop there. The branch has helped a number of components design surveys so that the data collected could be automatically entered into computer processors. SSB also simulated models of modules for the Office of Disability Operations so workflow could be analyzed. And SSB is currently developing a program that will help the Division of Realty and Space Management come up with choices of floor plans for a suite of offices given sets of constraints.

SSB also has programs that will help an office decide whether to purchase or lease equipment as well as assist with budget planning, real estate evaluation and risk analysis. SSB says it will acquire computer programs if a sufficient number of SSA users can be identified to justify

the cost.

SSB Analyst Bob Reynolds pointed out that their services are not limited to headquarters components. "We're here to help any SSA office—from BOs to PSCs. The workflow analysis and floor plan generation programs are just two that those away from headquarters might find useful. But offices are certainly not limited to something we've already devised or have on the drawing board."

Based on that exception, I am officially applying for a position on the new Commission on Redistricting. If selected, I could fill one of the positions that must go to a registered Republican.

The attached resume provides a snapshot of my long career in government and private industry. It also provides details on my long career in elected and appointed positions in Montgomery County and the City of Gaithersburg.

It should be evident to all that any jurisdiction should have fair and representative districts for all of its residents. 

I would like to put my name in to apply for a position on the redistricting commission. My name is Jason Makstein, I am a 35 year old father of 3 that was raised from birth in Montgomery county and love it so much that I decided to bring my wife and now family back here to live after leaving just for college. I live in District 1 and I am registered to vote as an independent. I am a father of a 5 year old, 3 year old, and 6 month old and am invested to do what I can to make our county better.

Educationally, I have a masters in Computer Science from Johns Hopkins University and a BS in Computer Science from Penn State (with a minor in math). I like to look at problems like this from a logical and rational perspective and being relatively new to paying attention to local politics I do not have many pre conceived notions about where the lines should go in order to benefit any individuals or groups.

I have never been a part of any political party because I don't believe in the idea of political parties which can put partisan politics over doing what is right. I take each issue individually and have no relations to anyone in office. I don't know specifically where any council members or perspective members live. I would do my best to ensure it stays that way through this process.

I have worked over the past 13 years on Air Traffic control software for the FAA (currently work for Leidos) which includes looking at extremely large dynamic sets of data. I feel my experience with large data sets, math, logic, problem solving and critical thinking would be vital on a committee like this. I also have some skills as a good team player and member of a team I will contribute positively and think I can also help negotiate any disputes using logic and discussion to come up with good district boundaries.

I would faithfully attempt to execute the following ideas in order to try to make fair boundaries:

- 1. Start over from scratch. I see no reason to start with what we already have especially if C or D passes, we need to start from scratch
- 2. Try to make contiguous, sensible districts based on geography. This means no weird shapes to include or exclude certain areas.
- 3. Take into account the type of communities and their needs. I would attempt to make it so that those within each district have similar type of needs. For example, the current DI that goes from heavily populated urban, to suburbs all the way to rural areas I do not feel is setup to be fair or equitable because the needs of the different parts of the district are so different (no disrespect meant to current council member who does a good job working to maintain this balance). Nothing is perfect but by attempting to divide based on the type of housing and land use, we can make it so that it is more likely those within a district have similar needs.

Full disclosure, I do have daytime limitations based on my job and kids so hoping I can be part of this and that meetings can be on evenings or weekends. I'm willing to put in the effort to work with everyone to come up with sensible boundaries that will guide the county in the years to come.

I am writing to express my interest in serving on the Montgomery County Redistricting Commission.

I have lived in Montgomery County since 1982 ... 20 years in the Town of Chevy Chase, 18 years in my current home in Sligo Park Hills, in Silver Spring on the border of Takoma Park. During that time, I have served in a variety of volunteer leadership roles that have familiarized me with issues and communities county-wide: five years as a PTA president (first at Takoma Park Middle School, then at Blair High School), two years as president of Montgomery Women (as well as several terms on that organization's board), several years as president of the Sligo Park Hills Civic Association, two years as president of the Montgomery County Women's Democratic Club (and several terms on the WDC Board, on which I continue to serve). I recently joined the Friends of Sligo Creek board. I am also active as a member and/or donor of quite a few county and national organizations (e.g., Manna, Shepherd's Table, the Jewish Council on the Aging on whose board I served for 10 years, the Maryland Legislative Agenda for Women, the Natural Resources Defense Council, Strathmore ... etc.). I was appointed twice to the Governor's Volunteer and Service Commission, for which I was honored to receive the 2002 Governor's award.

Additional volunteer roles have included serving as a member of the Silver Spring Citizens Advisory Council, working with Reemberto Rodrigues to complete short-term research projects such as a compilation of information about farmers markets and Double Dollars opportunities in greater Silver Spring, tutoring struggling second grade readers at Montgomery Knolls ES for five years, joining the policy committee of Montgomery Housing Partnership, convening and participating in Community Conversations about racial equity and social justice, serving on the County Executive's transition advisory team, and, currently, serving on the Community Reopening Advisory Group, plus others. My current volunteer work through WDC focuses on racial equity in public safety. For a moment, before COVID-19 restrictions made it impossible for me to continue, I was a volunteer senior advisor to Council VP Tom Hucker.

My leadership of countywide organizations has opened my eyes to the differing and sometimes conflicting views of people from different racial, socioeconomic, cultural, and geographic communities.

As a DC native whose parents were completely disenfranchised for most of my childhood, I value voting rights as only someone whose family had been denied those rights can do. People often ask me what compelled me to get involved in politics, and my answer always harkens back to what my family was denied. I have a bone-deep commitment to civil rights for all, which impelled me to work

with my state senator, Will Smith, to craft and pass adoption and parenting equality legislation here in Maryland as the logical bookend for marriage equality.

I've been retired from paid employment for nearly a decade, which seems to have only resulted in more work to do as a volunteer. How Women's Equity Can Make Democracy Stronger

A Day Without Women is a call to action for gender parity

Rosa Parks refused to move to the back of a segregated Montgomery, Alabama bus in protest. She was tired of giving in to discrimination. Her actions inspired the Montgomery Bus Boycott which, through severe financial impact and legal action, propelled the civil rights movement forward.

Today, in over 30 countries including the United States, women are striking. In years past, March 8 (International Women's Day) has been a day of global celebration and awareness for gender parity (social, economic, cultural, and political). The strike is an extension of this day that international organizers are describing as "a day of action organized by and for women who have been marginalized." A stronger, more reflective democracy is only achieved when women are part of the equation.

A stronger, more reflective democracy is only achieved when women are part of the equation.

Women around the world are tired of being marginalized. Despite making up 51% of the world's population, women struggle to reach parity in their community, workplace, and in politics. Issues like public safety, education, national security, and health care are issues where women should have a strong voice at the decision-making tables but systemic barriers keep them on the sidelines.

As the nation recovered from the economic recession in 2008, more women entered the workforce to support their families. According to the <u>Women's Bureau of the Department of Labor</u>, 57% of women are in the labor workforce. Six in 10 women (62.4%) occupy the part-time labor workforce, which often means they have limited access to benefits and likely receive lower wages.

Women occupy a majority of many "traditional" fields. Women represent an overwhelming majority in occupations like nursing (90%), secretaries (94%), and preschool teachers (97%). While these are considered traditional occupations for women, they often play an integral role in our healthcare, social, and workplace community. Unfortunately, even in fields where women dominate, the wage gap persists. In 2014, the Women's Bureau reported that full-time women earned 22% less than men—roughly 78 cents for every \$1.

Women are most affected by the environment. The United Nations 1995 Beijing Declaration and Platform for Action states that "women have an essential role to play in the development of sustainable and ecologically... natural resource management." Women are often the first impacted by negative environmental changes. As we have painfully learned from the Flint water crisis, safe drinking water and sanitation are not only issues that impact communities in the developing world. Toxins in the air or water can create health risks for mother and child. And when women lack access to land, it limits their ability to provide food or income for their family.

More women are needed in elected office. The United States ranks 104th for gender parity for elected office, with less than 20% of the seats in Congress being held by women. Representation2020 reports that in the last 25 years increased representation of women in politics has inched along slowly. While more women are being trained, many of the electoral structures across the U.S sustain institutional barriers that keep women's representation under 25% at the local and state level. In recent years, the major political parties have adopted gender parity rules for internal positions, yet these rules are not applied to how parties and PACs fund candidates.

International Women's Day is an opportunity for everyone to stand in solidarity with marginalized women in the U.S. and around the world. Now is the time for women to come together to create dignity and equity in the workplace through the right to organize and fair labor practices because worker's rights are human rights. Now is the time to build a sustainable future for our children and grandchildren by empowering women and men to use our limited natural resources responsibly because climate justice is social justice. Now is the time to increase the number of women at the decision-making table as policymakers by eliminated barriers to participation and developing structures that give women and men a level playing field to run, win, and serve in elected office because a reflective democracy is a fair democracy.

The goal of "A Day Without a Woman" is to put a spotlight on the impact women have in our workplace, economy, and society as a whole.

So, take the day off from paid or unpaid labor today, and then tomorrow fight for equal pay for women.

Shop locally, women- and minority-owned business today, and then tomorrow support women who are fighting for clean air, clean water, and better healthcare.

I applaud Gov. Hogan's efforts to address gerrymandering through an independent redistricting commission. Hogan rightly noted that both parties are guilty of using gerrymandering to their advantage, so it is time for a bipartisan solution. Back in February, President Obama called out state legislators in his home state for gerrymandering. I hope Obama does urge Maryland Democrats to take action on legislative proposals to end gerrymandering but it needs to include fair representation voting.

Independent redistricting commissions may stop politicians from using voters as pawns in their political map games, but they don't take the politics out of representation. In California, Democrats still have lopsided majorities in the state legislature and Congress even after moving to independent redistricting commissions. What these commissions fail to address is the unrepresentative winner-take-all system that does not foster competition or allow voters to fully express their preferences.

Winner-take-all systems for electing legislative members to the General Assembly or Congress can leave nearly half the voters in a district without a voice. This is evidenced by how like-minded voters are cut off from each other as Districts 4, 8 and 9 slice up Carroll County.

If Gov. Hogan wants to "deliver real change," Maryland needs multi-winner districts with fair representation voting. With fair representation, voters would elect between three and five representatives in larger districts, and like-minded voters would always earn their fair share of seats. That means more voices in Annapolis and Washington that reflect Maryland's diverse political views. Fair representation voting has already been proven at the local level, as a candidate-based proportional voting method to improve representation.

Democrats in Annapolis should not dig in and refuse to listen to the Governor or other legislators proposing common sense solutions to end gerrymandering and create fair representation. Along with the Governor's proposal, Democrats are ignoring proposals from their own members — like State Sen. Jamie Raskin's Potomac Compact proposal that includes independent redistricting commissions and fair voting options.

Our discussions in Maryland cannot focus solely on redrawing districts to balance representation for one party or another — after all, there is a growing number of unaffiliated voters in Maryland. Representative democracy should be driven by the will of the people. Let's make Maryland a state where every voice matters: include multi-winner districts with fair representation voting as part of the redistricting solution.

During this campaign cycle, many critics (such as Open Primaries) voiced dismay with party approaches to primary elections—another unique feature of the United States voting system.
