## **SUMMARY OF KEY DISCUSSION POINTS**

The expenditures for snow removal and wind and rainstorm cleanup exceed the FY22 appropriation of \$3,620,624 in the DOT budget and the appropriation of \$2,884,990 in the Climate Response Non-Departmental Account. As in previous years, due to the unpredictability of snow events, only a minimal amount is budgeted for snow removal operations as a matter of practice. The Recommended Budget is developed each year with the expectation that additional resources will be required to support snow removal activities at year-end. After review of actual expenses related to staff overtime, contractual services, and materials usage, a supplemental appropriation is requested.

During the winter of 2021-2022, Montgomery County experienced 9 snow/ice events with a total average snow/ice accumulation of approximately 16.41 inches. While some of the events did not result in plowing, both County and contractual personnel were required to report and/or be on standby. Equipment was also mobilized based on the weather forecasts. The total cost associated with snow removal operations was \$18,300,226, of which \$3,038,477 was budgeted. To date, wind and rainstorm cleanup expenditures are \$3,074,264, of which \$582,147 was budgeted. This supplemental appropriation also provides \$750,000 to cover wind and rainstorm cleanup costs that are anticipated in May and June 2022.

Department of Transportation -\$12,472,739 Department of General Services - \$3,146,137

I am recommending a Supplemental Appropriation to the FY22 Operating Budget for the Department of Transportation (DOT) in the amount of \$12,472,739 and the Department of General Services (DGS) in the amount of \$3,146,137 for snow removal and wind and rainstorm cleanup. This Supplemental request for DGS reflects the bulk of the Department's storm cleanup costs since DGS has no budget for storm cleanup. This Appropriation will fund snow removal and wind and rainstorm clean up expenditures incurred during FY22.

This increase is needed because expenditures for snow removal and wind and rainstorm cleanup exceed the FY22 Appropriation of \$3,620,624 and the NDA storm removal and storm cleanup Appropriation of \$2,884,990 in the Climate Response Non-Departmental Account. As in previous years, due to the unpredictability of snow events, only a minimal amount is budgeted for snow removal operations as a matter of practice. The Recommended Budget is developed each year with the expectation that additional resources will be required to support snow removal activities at year-end. The FY22 second quarter analysis estimated additional snow removal spending beyond the budgeted amount. After review of actual expenses related to staff overtime, contractual services, and materials usage, a Supplemental Appropriation is requested.

Supplemental Appropriation #22-89 to the FY22 Operating Budget; Supplemental for Snow Removal/Wind and Rainstorm Cleanup

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During the winter of 2021-2022, Montgomery County experienced nine snow/ice events with a total average snow/ice accumulation of approximately 16.41 inches. While some of the events did not result in plowing, both County and contractual personnel were required to report and/or be on standby. Equipment was also mobilized based on the weather forecasts. The total cost associated with snow removal operations was \$18,300,226 of which \$3,038,477 was budgeted. To date, wind and rainstorm cleanup expenditures are \$3,074,264, of which \$582,147 was budgeted.

In addition to expenditures incurred to date, this Supplemental Appropriation provides \$750,000 to cover wind and rainstorm cleanup costs that are anticipated in May and June of 2022. Damage from wind and rainstorms is unpredictable with the bulk of the cleanup historically occurring from April through September.

This Supplemental will reduce the County General Fund Undesignated Reserves by \$15,618,876 and is consistent with the fund balance policy for tax supported reserves.

### **Background**

- 1. Section 307 of the Montgomery County Charter provides that any supplemental appropriation shall be recommended by the County Executive who shall specify the source of funds to finance it. The Council shall hold a public hearing on each proposed supplemental appropriation after at least one week's notice. A supplemental appropriation that would comply with, avail the County of, or put into effect a grant or a Federal, State or County law or regulation, or one that is approved after January 1 of any fiscal year, requires an affirmative vote of five Councilmembers. A supplemental appropriation for any other purpose that is approved before January 1 of any fiscal year requires an affirmative vote of six Councilmembers. The Council may, in a single action, approve more than one supplemental appropriation. The Executive may disapprove or reduce a supplemental appropriation, and the Council may reapprove the appropriation, as if it were an item in the annual budget.
- 2. The County Executive has requested the following FY22 Operating Budget appropriation increases for the Department of Transportation and the Department of General Services:

- 4. The County Executive recommends a supplemental appropriation to the FY22 Operating Budget in the amount of \$15,618,876 for snow removal and wind and rainstorm cleanup and specifies that the source of funds will be General Fund Undesignated Reserves.
- 5. Notice of public hearing was given, and a public hearing was held.
