Planning's work program update includes their proposed FY24 work program schedule for master plans and studies. The Council did not receive a Semi-Annual update in the fall of 2022 due to changes at the Planning Board. The FY24 Proposed Master Plan and Major Projects Schedule as submitted in the FY24 Operating Budget is attached on © 1. The FY24 Proposed Master Plan and Major Projects Schedule: Update is attached on © 2.

The proposed schedule shows some plans and projects coming to Council ahead of the proposed schedule in the Operating Budget, including the Rustic Roads Functional Master Plan, the Amendment to the Master Plan for Historic Preservation, and the Friendship Heights Urban Design Study. The schedule also shows a minor delay in the Council's receipt of the Fairland - Briggs Chaney Master Plan and the Takoma Park Minor Master Plan Amendment. Delay in master plan deliveries is not unusual given the length of time required to complete a plan. The Clarksburg Master Plan Amendment is showing a delay of six months in the updated schedule, and the Silver Spring Communities Plan a delay of four months. The delay to the Silver Spring Plan is proposed to eliminate the Council's receipt of two master plans in the same two-month period just before the budget review season.

In addition to updating the current work program schedule, the Department is requesting four new projects be added: a Germantown employment corridor check in, a project to establish Thrive 2050 Plan implementation metrics, a curbside management project, and a Randolph Road corridor study. These four projects would be added to the Department's current work on ten other projects/studies and nine ongoing/upcoming master plans.

The work program will be discussed further as part of the Operating Budget review.
