1	Section 1. Section 2-5 of the Code is amended as follows:
2	2-5. [Reserved] Use of Consular Registration Cards for Identification.
3	Any County department or office may accept a valid consular registration
4	card as personal identification or proof of residence. In this Section. "consular
5	registration card" means an identification card issued by a foreign government to one
6	of its nationals living in the United States after sufficient verification of the card
7	holder's identity and place of residence. The County Executive must issue
8	regulations under method (3) listing the countries that [[the Executive has
9	determined]] impose verification requirements that reasonably ensure the reliability
10	of information on a consular registration card. At least once every 12 months. the
11	Executive must review the list and may add or delete a country by regulation under
12	method (3).
13	Sec. 2. Regulations.
14	The County Executive must issue the regulations required by Section 2-5 of
15	the Code, as amended by this Act, no later than 90 days after this Act becomes law.
