AN ACT to:

- (1) require the Office of Management and Budget to submit pedestrian and bicyclist impact statements with certain capital projects in the Capital Improvements Program;
- (2) authorize the Council to require other County departments and agencies to supplement the impact statements furnished by the Office of Management and Budget; and
- (3) repeal obsolete provisions, and generally amend County law regarding the analysis of transportation and other capital projects.
