SUBJECT: Expedited Bill 25-18, Health and Sanitation – Special Needs Housing - Renaming

PURPOSE: Action - Council roll call vote required

Expedited Bill 25-18, Health and Sanitation – Special Needs Housing - Renaming, sponsored by Lead Sponsor Council President Riemer at the request of the County Executive, was introduced on June 19, 2018. A public hearing was held on July 10 at which there was one speaker, Leslie Frey on behalf of the County Executive who supported Bill 25-18 (©10).

Bill 25-18 would change the name of the Special Needs Housing Unit within the Department of Health and Human Services to more accurately reflect the services provided; modernize the County Code by updating the recently changed names of state and local programs and clarify the boards, committees, and commissions to which the Department provides staff support; and generally amend County law governing the Department.

Because of the technical nature of Bill 25-18, Councilmember Leventhal, Chair of the Health and Human Services Committee, decided that Bill 25-18 did not require Committee review. Council staff recommends enactment of Bill 25-18.

I am writing to request Council approval of the attached bill. This bill amends County law to change the name of the service area within the Department of Health and Human Services from "Special Needs Housing" to "Services to End and Prevent Homelessness." The proposed name more accurately reflects the work of the service area related to addressing homelessness.

Since 2003, the service area addressing the needs of this population has been named Special Needs Housing in both County Code and regulations. Since Ms. Amanda Harris has become Chief of this service area, she has undertaken a re-organization of the unit. Renaming the service area to "Services to End and Prevent Homelessness" complements the reorganization and more clearly describes the functions of the service area and the population it serves. The Fiscal Impact Statement is attached reflecting no changes in revenue and expenditure associated with this proposed bill.

# Health and Human Services – Special Needs Housing Division Name Change – Services to End and Prevent Homelessness

#### 1. Legislative Summary

Expedited Bill XX-18, introduced at the request of the County Executive, changes the name of the Special Needs Housing Division within the Department of Health and Human Services to Services to End and Prevent Homelessness. The change is requested to better reflect the work performed by the division in serving clients who are homeless or at risk of becoming homeless.

The bill also makes technical changes to the County Code to update the recently changed name of the Maryland Department of Health and other local entities, as well as to include recently created commissions in the list of entities supported by the Department.

2. An estimate of changes in County revenues and expenditures regardless of whether the revenues or expenditures are assumed in the recommended or approved budget. Includes source of information, assumptions, and methodologies used.

To change the name of the Special Needs Housing Division is estimated to cost approximately \$5,000 to reprint business cards and brochures as needed. This cost can be absorbed within the Department's FY19 appropriation. There will not be an operational impact for the Department in implementing this name change. There is no anticipated impact on revenues.

## TESTIMONY ON BEHALF OF COUNTY EXECUTIVE ISIAH LEGGETT ON EXPEDITED BILL 25-18, HEALTH AND SANITATION – SPECIALS NEEDS HOUSING

JULY 10, 2018

Good afternoon Council President Riemer and members of the County Council. I am Leslie Frey, Legislative Analyst with the Department of Health and Human Services. I am here today to testify on behalf of County Executive Leggett and Amanda Harris, Chief of Special Needs Housing. We support Expedited Bill 25-18 which would change the name of the Special Needs Housing service area in HHS to "Services to End and Prevent Homelessness." The bill also makes changes to the County Code to update names of state and local programs.

As you know, the County offers housing and related supportive services with a mission to prevent and end homelessness for all Montgomery County residents. This name change will more accurately and succinctly convey what we do and whom we serve. We have heard feedback that the name "Special Needs Housing" may lead one think that we serve only residents with disabilities. By adopting this name change, it will be clear that we support all County residents who are facing challenges related to their housing needs.

We therefore ask for your support of Expedited Bill 25-18. Thank you for the opportunity to testify this afternoon.
