- (3) require the independent investigators to submit a final written report to the State's Attorney;
- (4) make the written report public under certain circumstances; and
- (5) generally amend the law governing investigations of an officer involved death.

[Reserved] Law Enforcement Trust and Transparency Act. *Definitions.* As used in this Section: 3 (a) Department means the Montgomery County Department of Police. 4 Law enforcement agency means a government agency charged with 5 enforcing Federal, State, or County law. 6 7 Officer involved death means the death of an individual resulting from an action by a police officer or while the individual is in police custody. 8 9 *Police officer* means a sworn officer employed by the County Department of Police. 10 *State's Attorney* means the State's Attorney for Montgomery County. 11 Independent investigation required. [[The]] Except as provided in 12 (b) subsection (f), the Executive must ensure that an independent 13 investigation is performed for each officer involved death. 14 independent investigation must be [[performed]] led by at least 2 sworn 15 independent investigators: 16 who are not employed by the County or the State's Attorney; 17 (1) (2) who have significant experience and expertise in conducting 18 [complex criminal] homicide and law enforcement officer use of 19 force investigations; and 20 work for a: 21 (3) local law enforcement agency located outside of the 22 (A) 23 County; Federal law enforcement agency; or 24 (B) 25 (C) State law enforcement agency.
