SUBJECT: Amendment to FY13 Operating Budget
Resolution 17-443, Section G, FY13 Designation of Entities for
Non-Competitive Contract Award Status

Background

1. Section 11B-14(a) (4) of the Montgomery County Code states that “a contract may be awarded without competition if the Chief Administrative Officer makes a written determination that the contract award serves a public purpose and a proposed contractor has been identified in a grant or appropriation resolution approved by the Council.” The result of this action is to amend the FY13 Designation of Entities for Non-Competitive Contract Award status resolution to include the agency listed below.
2. The Chief Administrative Officer has determined that funding for the contract with this entity serves a public purpose and that such an expense would be in the public interest.
3. The Department of Health and Human Services will fund the contract with the Provider listed below from existing appropriations for FY13.
4. The Department of Health and Human Services will amend its existing contract with the Primary Care Coalition (PCC) of Montgomery County, Inc. for provision of services as stated in the amended FY13 Designation of Entities for Non-Competitive Contract Award.

Action

The County Council for Montgomery County, Maryland, approves the following action:

The Council approves an amendment to the Designation of Entities for Non-Competitive Contract Award and thereby amends Resolution 17-443, Section G, FY13 Designation of Entities for Non-Competitive Contract Award. The Chief Administrative Officer has recommended this action and stated amending the contract for this vendor serves a public purpose and is in the public interest.

The FY13 Designation of Entities for Non-Competitive Contract Award Status resolution is amended to increase:

The existing contract with PCC of Montgomery County, Inc. from the approved amount of \$10,270,477 to the amended amount of \$10,340,477.

The additional FY13 funds are to provide for the implementation of a certified electronic health record system (EHR) through the PCC for the Montgomery Cares network of non-profit primary care providers. Implementing an EHR will enhance quality and continuity of care for Montgomery Cares patients. It will also enhance the efforts of PCC and its Montgomery Cares subcontractors to establish Primary Care Medical Homes and achieve other goals of the Affordable Care Act.
