## Recycling in Montgomery County is Easy!

Why recycle? Making new things from recycled materials saves money, energy, and the Earth's natural resources. It is so important that Montgomery County has made it easy for you and your family to recycle by providing a blue recycling bin and a blue mixed paper wheeled cart so your recyclable materials are picked up at the curb in front of your house on your recycling day.

## What happens to recyclable materials after they are picked up?

Bring life to recycling by coloring in the recycling process.


You place empty and clean recyclable materials in the Commingled Materials bin and the Mixed Paper cart and they are collected at your curb.


New products and packaging are produced and sent

Montgomery County collects and transports the materials to the Montgomery County Recycling Center.

## Mini Flower Vase

What You Need:

- Three paper or plastic cups
- Glue
- Tissue paper or fabric
- Some dry beans or rice


## What You Do:

- Place a cup on a table and fill it halfway with dry beans or rice.
- Glue a second cup to the first, top to top.
- Glue a third cup to the
 second, bottom to bottom.
- To decorate, glue small pieces of torn tissue paper or fabric all over the cups.


## Other Recycling Craft Ideas:

- Paste your favorite pictures from magazines or draw on paper bags and use as gift wrap.
- Keep the lids on several different coffee cans to make a drum set.
- Decorate used clean food Containers, like those for coffee, oatmeal, or Cream cheese and use as storage containers.
- Cut rings from paper towel or bathroom tissue rolls and then paint and decorate them and use as napkin rings. You can also make puppets and rocket ships from these rolls.
