Please review the following reminders before you start to clean:

If the 'submit' button does not work, please save a copy to your computer and then click 'submit'.

- You are responsible for the disposal of trash. If more than four large or heavy bags of trash or debris are
 collected and assistance with disposal is needed, call MC311 by dialing 3-1-1 (or 240-777-0311). Let the
 operator know you are an AAR participant requesting a one-time trash pick-up (be sure to gather trash in
 one location off the sidewalk and roadway). You can also submit your request online by visiting
 montgomerycountymd.gov/311.
- There is no special pick up for recyclables. If you choose to collect recyclables, please use the blue 24x24
 handle bag listed above. Empty recyclables into your own home or business recycling bin for your
 scheduled collection. For recycling questions visit montgomerycountymd.gov/recycling.



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- Clean-up activities should be performed off the roadway, during daylight hours and in good weather
 conditions. Avoid peak traffic times. Avoid overexertion and drink plenty of water. Members should face
 oncoming traffic and stay clear of the roadway at all times. Maintain a first aid kit and have it available.
- Adopted road segments are to be <u>cleaned as needed</u>, with a minimum of six (6) times a year (equivalent to every other month) and <u>submit the cleaning results afterward to the AAR Program</u>. If cleanings are <u>performed more often or if the road does not require a cleaning</u>, we would still like you to submit a report. These reports let us know that you are meeting your commitment and serve as a record of your activities should a complaint arise regarding the cleanliness of your adopted road segment.

Report cleaning efforts either online at montgomerycountymd.gov/aar-report or by email at mcdot.outreach@montgomerycountymd.gov. When reporting, please provide the following information:

- ✓ Name of participant and road cleaned;
- ✓ Date of cleaning;
- ✓ Total number of volunteers involved;
- ✓ Number of bags of trash and/or recyclables collected; and
- ✓ Type of trash bags used (exp. tall kitchen bag, lawn/leaf bag, small grocery store bag, AAR blue or orange bag, etc.)
- Do not touch or try to remove materials that you suspect may be toxic or hazardous, such as batteries, powders, chemicals, smelly substances, suspicious packages, chemical drums or containers, weapons, syringes or needles and dead animal carcasses. Report hazardous materials to MC311.
- Do not consume alcoholic beverages or drugs before or during your cleaning session and make sure to watch out for ticks, bees and snakes.
- Report illegally posted signs, including those on traffic signs, telephone poles and/or in medians to MC311 by calling 311 within Montgomery County or 240-777-0311. If the signs are legal, they will display a permit number, usually on the back (do not confront a sign owner).
- Clean-up attire should consist of light-colored clothing and long sleeves, heavy gloves, and sturdy soled footwear.
- If you have a student assisting with the cleaning, you can request Student Service Learning (SSL) hours by sending an email to mcdot.outreach@montgomerycountymd.gov. Include the date of cleaning, student's name, the road segment cleaned, and total hours the student worked. A letter will be drafted and sent to you that the student can attach to his/her SSL form when turning it in (a sample of this letter was included in your approval packet).

The success of this program depends upon volunteer participation. We thank you for helping us keep Montgomery County a cleaner more attractive place to live, by removing unsightly litter from County roadsides before it reaches local streams or clogs storm drains that feed into the Potomac and Patuxent Rivers and our water supply.
