

MONTGOMERY COUNTY TYPES OF RACKS

RACK INFORMATION

Not all bike racks are the same, some function better than others. Bike racks should allow an individual to lock their bicycle on two points of the rack. Below are pictures of some bike racks which are recommended as well as bike racks which are not recommended.

RECOMMENDED BIKE RACKS

Recommended racks support the bike with at least two points of contact; minimize the potential for damage by not binding the wheel; and allow the user to lock the frame and at least one wheel. These racks are suggestions - there may be others that work well.



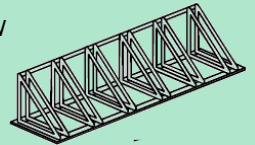
ACCEPTABLE, BUT NOT PREFERRED, BIKE RACKS

The serpentine style provides only one point of contact, so bikes fall easily unless parked parallel to the rack.



NOT RECOMMENDED BIKE RACKS

These racks can cause damage to bike wheels and frames and do not readily allow locking of both frame and wheel.



BIKE CORRALS

Bike corrals are multiple racks placed in a given area. If there is insufficient bicycle parking, or a high count of bicyclists in an area, you may want to consider a bike corral. If you would like a bike corral in your area, contact Kyle Lukacs.



ART RACKS
