Chief J. Thomas Manger was sworn in as the Chief of the Montgomery County Department of Police in February 2004 and has led the department with a commitment to the highest ethical standards for policing. Chief Manger has been a dedicated public servant to an extremely diverse Montgomery County community for over 15 years. During his tenure, Chief Manger forged strong and meaningful relationships that ensured robust outreach efforts to all communities throughout the County. His message was one of inclusiveness, ensuring that department members carried out their mission with compassion, transparency and professionalism. During some of the most difficult times in policing, Chief Manger's focus on integrity and justice for all members of the community was apparent to all. Chief Manger has had an exemplary and stellar career worthy of our enduring gratitude, our true esteem and our collective respect.

His tireless efforts in Montgomery County, as well as throughout the nation as observed in his positions with the Major City Chiefs Association and the Police Executive Research Forum, were recognized by numerous organizations over the years. In 2007 he received the James S. Brady Law Enforcement Award (2007). In 2012, he was inducted into the Montgomery County Human Rights Hall of Fame and recognized with the Community Champion Award from the Youth Leadership Foundation as well. He also received the Montgomery County Victims' Rights Foundation Public Safety Award (2014), the Anti-Defamation League's Gorowitz Institute Service Award (2017), and the National Immigration Forum's Keeper of the Dream Award. Recently he was further recognized as a 2018 Washingtonian of the Year. In 2019, Chief Manger also received a Service Award from the Montgomery County Employees' Black History Program Committee.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDERED that to properly acknowledge and remember the indelible mark Chief Manger has left on the Montgomery County community and the Police Department, and in recognition of his 42 years dedicated to public safety, the Public Safety Headquarters at 100 Edison Park Drive, Gaithersburg, Maryland, will be renamed the Chief J. Thomas Manger Public Safety Headquarters.
