COMMON CONCERNS SEEN BY EMSQA

TOR: If you think you need to call, you're doing it wrong.

The authority to terminate a resuscitation lies solely with the on-scene clinician, as outlined in the Termination of Resuscitation (TOR) protocols.

To terminate a resuscitation, the patient must meet the TOR criteria in the protocol.

If they do not meet the criteria, a physician cannot authorize a TOR.

Contacting the hospital for "TOR Orders" indicates you are deviating from the TOR protocols outlined in the MMP

DO NOT CONFUSE TOR with a verbal DNR when paperwork is not immediately available, but you have substantial evidence to believe that a patient or legal decision-maker did not desire to be resuscitated (ex: Hospice)
