





COMMON CONCERNS SEEN BY EMSQA

Dispatch History is Medical History

CAD notes contain valuable information. It is imperative that they are read and integrated into your clinical judgement

Location for RapidSOS is not available

PROBLEM: BACK PAIN
DISPATCH LEVEL: 05C04 (DIFFICULTY BREATHING)
20-YEAR-OLD, MALE, CONSCIOUS, BREATHING.

- 1. THIS STARTED/HAPPENED NOW (LESS THAN 6HRS AGO).
- 2. IT'S NOT KNOWN WHAT CAUSED HIS BACK PAIN.
- 3 HE IS RESPONDING NORMALLY (COMPLETELY ALERT).
- 4. HE IS HAVING DIFFICULTY BREATHING
- 5. A HISTORY OF DIACHOSED AURTIC ANEURYSM HAS NOT BEEN REPORTED.

BACK PAIN - ALS1: BACK PAIN - ALS1[Agency/IRF]

Get a dispatch history to include:

- Presence of the complaint before you arrived
- History
- Treatments

The 911 operator said that you were having difficulty breathing. How is your breathing now?



Ask about and consider carefully:

- Differences between dispatched complaint and current presentation
- Resolved complaint (eg syncope, DEC LOC, chest pain, dyspnea, weakness, etc)
