## The ePCR narrative:

- Reflects only things relating to the patient and care provided
- Accuracy matters...times, procedures, medications
- Proofread! Grammar! Punctuation!



## The FireApp narrative:

- Scene findings
- Crew actions
- Unusual circumstances
- PPE levels
