Regional Manager's Report

- Staffing
  - One circulation staff member voluntarily transferred to another branch
  - Two open circulation positions and one open Children's Library Associate position
    - Offers have been made for the Children's Library Associate position and Kate has not been given any further updates
- Programming
  - Previously
    - Master Gardener lecture recently
    - First bilingual English-Spanish storytime last weekend
  - Upcoming
    - Board of elections table upcoming
    - Another Master Gardener lecture upcoming
    - Elephant and Piggy on Friday, October 20, 2023
      - Two back to back
    - Grades 4 to 6 book club starting soon
    - STEM storytime
    - Augmented reality event on Saturday, November 11, 2023
    - First Teen Advisory Board meeting on Thursday, September 21, 2023
    - More bilingual storytimes forthcoming
      - These are done both in English and Spanish
  - More generally, some programming has been filling up/needing to turn people away recently
    - This is a result of capacity in the space
    - Sometimes there are storytimes or other events held twice back to back but that depends on if the presenter is willing and if there is funding for it
  - FOLMC Funding
    - This can be used for events but presently the library staff has no information specifically about how much money there is
    - Previously there was no budget for each branch from FOLMC but there will be a budget soon
      - No idea how much the budget will be

- Once the budget of FOLMC money is set for each branch, there will be an expectation that it is spent
- This should make it easier to plan because this is how programming is funded at the branch level
- Questions from Jim Montgomery
  - Is there a spike in lending of books around storytime?
    - Anecdotally, it's busier at that time and there are more people around the library but Kate is unaware of the specific lending data around storytimes
    - That data almost certainly exists but is not readily available, Kate will look into it
  - If the demand for storytimes or other programming drastically increased, what would be needed to accommodate that?
    - More staff
- Facilities
  - The Noise is gone
    - There was a leak in the fire suppression system and the compressor had to work almost constantly to maintain pressure
    - This was not an issue in the sense that it was a safety hazard, just that things weren't working as intended
    - Has been fixed
  - Cones purchased to block off staff parking spots on Sunday
    - One got run over
  - Camera has been installed outside in the courtyard
    - Looking at opening it up to the public in the Spring
      - Some physical work needs to be done
        - Is the furniture out there sufficient? Does more need to be purchased?
        - Cosmetic work, needs a power-wash
        - Need to determine procedures
          - The door to the courtyard is currently an emergency exit door and will need to not be one

Jim Montgomery's Report from the Board

- Tomorrow night the Weihua Zhou (Performance Management & Data Analyst) is presenting to the Board
  - Jim to ask how many vacancies there currently are
- Tomorrow's meeting is the first one since the summer break
- This is the traditional kickoff of advocacy season
  - Going to focus on the strategic plan and early childhood literacy
    - County Executive remains highly interested in early childhood literacy
      - Rate of early childhood literacy and kindergarten preparedness has not increased in the county in the last three years

- Jim wants to draw a direct line between the libraries and early childhood literacy
- Wants County Council and County Executive to view libraries as a resource to address this problem
- Budget Forums start on Thursday. September 14, 2023 and there will be 10(?) in total
  - Bethesda-Chevy Chase forum will be on Wednesday, September 27, 2023 from 7:00-8:30 at the Bethesda/Chevy Chase Regional Services Center
