Liaison's Report

- Board met May 8
- Many library board members met with County Councilmembers to request the budget
 - None of the enhancement budget was approved (world languages etc)
 - Will Jawando suggested that funding for the digital collection be rolled into operating budget and not enhancement budget
- Kate presented on the various branches she oversees
- Freedom to Read Act
 - MD State initiative that the state legislature passed
 - Protection at the county level and in schools, for books of all ideas to be represented
- Grace is on the search committee for the library director
 - Position closed May 12
 - Applications being reviewed, and interviews will be conducted throughout the summer
 - o Interim director yet to be named, after current director steps down
