## Montgomery County Cultural Plan -

Used to identify priorities, guide investment, and inform local policies regarding arts and culture integration into everyday lives in the county. Belonging, Cultural Resilience, and Intersectionality have risen to the top of priorities of residents. As the County becomes more diverse, how do we incorporate that diversity into the cultural vitality of the county?

## 2. Residential Energy Programs

Larissa Johnson, Residential Energy Program Manager, Department of Environmental Protection montgomeryenergyconnection.org
This is an effort to educate residents about electricity. Montgomery Energy Connection is a county program to disburse this information.

Best way to save on energy is to use less! Get a free Quick Home Energy Check Up for free, or Pay \$100 for a \$400 Home Performance Audit, which is very thorough and will end up saving you a lot in energy; comes with rebates for some of the bigger fixes. Check out the Utility marketplace for below market cost efficient products. Also check out Montgomery County Energy Efficiency Tax Credit (\$250).

Best way to move away from fossil fuels is to electrify your home. Check out "Electrify MC" for financial incentives. Check out "Switch Together" program to go solar at about 30% less - it is a government sponsored coop.

#### 3. Wheaton Placemaking

Jessica McVary, Planning Supervisor, Montgomery County Planning

Department - Update on **Wheels in Wheaton** event May 31(12-8) - June 1 (11 - 7). Objectives: Improve connectivity and safety, repurpose underutilized public space, showcase possibilities for future improvements and investments, support Wheaton's sense of place.

Community wants more spaces to gather casually, food/entertainment outdoors, enhanced safety, enhanced small businesses.

Wheels in Wheaton will feature a pop-up roller rink and live mural painting in the surface parking lot (Lot 13) in the triangle. There will be games, cafe seating, beer garden, DJ, chalk plaza, and skateboarding instruction.

Challenge: how to retain some of the benefits of these events. There will be materials that can be reused and a toolbox of strategies for this kind of initiative.

From Crystal: After Lighting Walk, she met with DOT, PEPCO, and CIP to prioritize what to address first. Some lights can be upgraded with higher wattage. Will use current year funds to address. board with adding fixtures and upgrading others. She will get us a complete report on locations and nature of approved improvements by our next meeting.
