Question and Answer

- Will the facility be self-funded?
 - o No, Montgomery County Recreation is funded with taxpayer dollars.
- What is the progress and plan for the demolishing and rebuilding of the Elizabeth House?
 - HOC currently working on securing funds to demolish Elizabeth House prior to the opening of SSRAC.
- What is the parking situation going to look like for the new building?
 - Parking is available in the Cameron St. garage. There is also limited on-street parking. Parking fees will apply.
- How will the pass memberships and daily admission work for this facility?
 - No final decision yet. That's why we are here today, to hear what you would like to see.
- Do you plan to keep the current classes that are held at the Martin Luther King Jr. Swim Center?
 - Yes, the opening of this facility should not impact the classes offered at MLK.
- How much would do you anticipate the passes or daily fees will be?
 - Those decision have not yet been made. That's why we are here today, to hear what you would like to see.
- How do you anticipate the Holy Cross floor to function? If there is an emergency in the building, would they respond?
- What are the plans for safety in the facility? Would there be security guards?
- What hours and days of the week would the facility operate?
 - We believe the facility will be open seven days a week.
- Since this is connected to senior housing do you plan to have senior programs? For example, senior meals?
 - Yes, absolutely.
- Do you envision this being an aquatic facility for just the public or for high school teams as well?

- o This facility will be open to everyone.
- Could heaters and covers be put at the outdoor pools for the teams to use all year round?
 - We have been looking into that. That funding would be part of the capital improvement budget.
- Will there be movable floors in the swimming pool?
 - o No. However, there will be a shallow pool with a maximum depth of four feet.
