Community Recreation Centers (Facilities)

Montgomery County Recreation has 22 Recreation Centers located throughout the County that offer a wide range of activities for children, teens and adults, and may include programs for seniors and individuals with disabilities. Activities typically include classes, workshops, clinics, drop-in programs, supervised play, sports, open gym, crafts and special events. Our centers have diverse amenities that may include fitness rooms, social halls, meeting spaces, classrooms, billiards and game rooms. In Summer 2024, we are adding a Girl's Varsity division in our High School Summer Basketball League.
 Currently 11 teams from across the County have registered.

Spring Sport Leagues:

- 3v3 Basketball: Launched Friday, April 5 with 144 participants across 4 locations (Upper County CRC, White Oak CRC, Coffield CRC, East County CRC). Collaborated with our Youth Development team to hold a special 3v3 mini league at Leleck ES.
- NFL Flag Football League: Launching Sunday, May 5 with 343 participants across 2 locations (Wheaton HS, Damascus CRC). An 85% increase from Spring 2023 (185 participants).
- Adult Soccer launched Saturday, April 6 with 1,253 participants across 8 divisions.
- Adult Softball launched Monday, April 8 with 78 teams across 10 divisions. Approximately 1,170 participants at 15 participants per team.
- Youth Volleyball League: Launched Saturday, April 6 with 275 participants across 4 locations (Ross Boddy CRC, East County CRC, Plum Gar CRC, Mid County CRC).
- Adult Volleyball League: Launched on April 14 with 65 participants at 1 location (Silver Spring Recreation and Aquatic Center).
- Adult Pickleball Leagues: 171 participants across 7 divisions at 3 locations (Bauer CRC, Longwood CRC, Damascus CRC).
- Adult Basketball Drop-in and Team Leagues: 104* participants across 3 divisions at 2 locations (Bauer CRC, Coffield CRC *NEW*location for Women). * Based on 10 players per team in Men's divisions.
- *NEW* TR Adult Kickball League: Launched Sunday, April 28 with 31 participants at 1 location (Bauer CRC).

Preparing for Summer Camp 2024:

- Our theme is "Power of Play", a back to the basics of how crucial the role of play is in helping our campers and staff develop social skills, build lifelong friendships and have fun.
- Held our first department training, "Power of Play with Jim Cain" to teach and engage connections between 127 career staff across the department. Dr. Jim Cain has authored 31 team and community building texts and is known for his ability to share his knowledge on subjects ranging from teamwork and leadership to interactive play. IT /Automation Team

The IT Team administers the primary recreation management software RecTrac, branded as ActiveMONTGOMERY, that facilitates customers activity registrations, facility reservations within recreation centers, and pass membership sales.

Senior members of team provide regularly scheduled training classes and training materials to more than 250 career staff and over 500 part-time staff on navigating the software system regarding the processes for conducting transactions for recreational services. Rec IT works in close collaboration with the county's Finance Department to ensure financial interfaces and reconciliations are accurately integrated and reported daily to the county's financial systems.

In addition to RecTrac the team is responsible for Recreation's IT infrastructure, hardware, and software needs for all teams and facilities within the Department from procurement through install and end-user training. REC IT ensures the Department's practices regarding use of information systems and resources comply and align to the county's Administrative Procedures and information security best practices.

- Implemented new configurations in VSI to allow customers to self withdrawal from enrolled activities through ActiveMontgomery, where refund amounts are automatically assessed based on new refund policy effective for transactions on or after May 13th.
- Issuance of Mobile Device Managed (MDM) phone upgrades for staff have begun.

- Pass visit background visit processing testing completed. Pilot at Wheaton Center successful and implemented at MLK Swim Center. Germantown Swim Center implementation to be completed.

- Senior Programs staff had a great time at the Active Aging Expo at Bohrer Park on 4/24. We tabled in the exhibit hall and provided information on Senior Programs, Senior Centers and our Active Adult Program Locations.
- The Long Branch Fashion Show had about 80 come to participate or watch on 4/24. Models took a trip
 to Chico's a few days prior to the event where they worked with a stylist at the store and all the clothes
 were donated for the models in the fashion show.

- Our Basketball Skills Competition at White Oak on 4/17 has 22 participants.

Youth Development

Montgomery County Recreation's Youth Development Team uses a variety of means to reach the County's diverse young people. Our recreation activities and services allow children and teens to make the most of their time outside of school.

Updates:

- All Youth Development afterschool programs in partnership with MCPS continue to operate at 46 locations. Current enrollment is **8761** (an increase of 1094 from previous report) and we continue to enroll new participants weekly. Programs are beginning to prepare for end of year events with RecXtra, EBBM & RecZone programming ending in mid to late May. EBBE ends early June.

- -Staffing Anticipating onboarding two new Recreation Specialists during May to fill existing vacancies. Currently still recruiting and interviewing to fill 2 career vacancies within the team (1 Rec Specialists for EBBM with recent resignation, 1 Rec Supervisor). See attached specific job ads for these positions to help with promotion.
- -Special Programs Participated with Teen Mental Health Awareness Week activities in collaboration with MCPL and others; Held two successful Teens Day Out including the new location at SSRAC; Summer Teen Guide published!
 -Elementary Programs- Cricket tournament held with Leleck EBBE & Key EBBM students at Leleck; Burnt Mills & Leleck 3 on 3 basketball tournament participation with CWP Sports. Parent engagement events continue and teams are planning for celebration week to culminate the year.
- -Middle Programs- Police program continues with RecXtra starting in May at Briggs Chaney; Mini sessions added at several EBBM locations to address waitlist and enrollment; RecXtra Wood MS flag football club participating in CWP sports league
- -High School Programs- Completed the Upper County Weekend RecZone program; Beinvenidos Spring Program kicking off at high schools including local trips, guest speakers and opportunities to join existing Recreation program for newcomer youth; Participated in Newcomers Summit 4/14; S4C Spring session has started with 32 total teams; TeenWorks continues to have information sessions and interviews to fill summer placements; offered professional development training opportunities on resume writing; participated in multiple recruitment/job fair events; Volunteers participated in Volunteer Brainstorming Session, Resume Writing Training, Pink Room Organization, Canal Community Days, ZTAG & other support at KDO/TDO, Academy of the Holy Cross serving lunch to Seniors and pot painting/planting activity, ZTAG at EBBE BM, Leveling the Playing Field, and MANNA Food Box Packing; RecZones started a spring skateboarding program at local skateparks; RecZones participated in Aquatics Rec Regatta event with teens constructing cardboard boats for the race! 
