

Montgomery Parks Operating Budget FY25

- On March 14th, Montgomery County Executive Elrich released his recommended budget that contained a 6% increase for the Montgomery County portion of the Commission. As a result, the Commission must reduce the proposed budget for both the Administration and Park Funds. A total reduction of \$6,684,713, or 3.7% was recommended.
- Non-recommend Cuts to Meet County Executive's Budget / Park Fund
 - Parks asked for \$11.5 (9.3%) increase over FY24.
 - o The gap is \$4.2 M (adjusted)
 - Parks will meet the gap:
 - Tier 1 \$1.06M Fully funding a Same Service Budget: Operating Budget Impacts (OBI, Inflationary, Contractual
 - Tier 2 \$599K Program Enhancement: Activation Signature Event (Park General Maintenance Worker), Assistant Barn Manager, Data Analyst and Data Services, PROS Implementation, Customer Service Assistant, Grants Administrator and Lease of High-Volume Mowers
 - Tier 3 \$686K GIS Specialist, Outreach Specialist, Nature and Outdoor Program for Senior Community, Graphic Design, and Herbicide Free Weed Control Initiative
 - Total of 3 tiers; \$2.4M
 - Reductions \$1.8M
- In Comparison: Montgomery Parks makes up only 2.2% of the County's total Operating Budget
