We may be in the heart of winter, but warmer weather is right around the corner and it's time to start planning for spring registration, which will begin at 6:30 a.m. on Monday, Feb. 12, for County residents for most programs and

Registration for Bone Builders, Day Trippers and Senior Outdoor Adventures in Recreation (SOAR) will begin at 9 a.m. Non-County residents will be able to register for Recreation's programs beginning at 6:30 a.m. on Wednesday, Feb. 14.

Spring program offerings are tailored to a variety of interests, skill levels and ages, and include fitness, sports, visual and performing arts, therapeutic recreation and more. There are hundreds of programs available that promote an active, healthier lifestyle. Programs, and the digital GUIDE, are now viewable online.

Applications are currently being accepted for Recreation's financial assistance program, Rec Assist, which provides eligible County residents with \$400 per eligible family member to use toward Recreation programs and activities.

While online registration is encouraged, registration will also be available by mail, drop-off or in-person. On Feb. 12, in-person registration will be available at 6:30 a.m. at four of the County's <u>aquatic centers</u> (Germantown, Kennedy Shriver, Martin Luther King Jr., Olney) and at the administrative offices in <u>Wheaton</u>.

Rec Regatta Sets Sail in April



Showcase your creativity and join us at the Olney Swim Center for this year's Rec Regatta on Saturday, April 27 from Noon to 3 p.m. Participants will make their own cardboard boats in advance and compete to see which boat goes the fastest and survives the longest before sinking! Awards will be given for the fastest boat, best design, team spirit and more.

Boats and paddles may only be created from clean cardboard and duct tape and must hold two people. The bottom of boat may not be covered with duct tape. Boats may be a maximum width of five feet and a maximum length of seven feet. Family groups can have all ages participate in boat creation but must be 10 or older to be in the boat.

Registration is \$10 per boat and can be completed via <u>ActiveMONTGOMERY</u>.

### **Get Your Free RecFit Membership Today**



RecFit passes continue to be FREE for Montgomery County residents in 2024. The <u>free pass</u> provides access to fully equipped fitness rooms, open gym (drop-in) activities and game rooms at any community recreation center during regularly scheduled hours.

Watch our RecFit playlist on YouTube to learn about how residents throughout the County have taken advantage of the free pass.

Residents must register for the fitness pass in-person at the <u>centers</u>. Proof of residency (a valid photo ID with an address or a photo ID with a current utility bill) must be provided by County residents to receive the free pass. Non-County residents can purchase a pass at a price of \$20 for one month, \$80 for six months and \$150 for one year. Visit the <u>website</u> for more information.

If you signed up for a free pass in 2023 there is no need to get a new pass for 2024. Your pass will remain valid. In 2023, more than 100,000 RecFit passes were issued, a significant increase from past years. In 2022, there were 26,065 passes issued.

### **KSAC** to Close for Renovations



Kennedy Shriver Aquatic Center (KSAC) will close on June 28, 2024, for renovations. The project, led by the County's Department of General Services (DGS) is expected to last at least two years.

Annual passes will continue to be valid at all County indoor and outdoor pools. We have indoor facilities located in Olney, Germantown and White Oak. In addition, the new Silver Spring Recreation and Aquatic Center is scheduled

to open prior to the KSAC closure. Our seven outdoor pools are located throughout the County and are open between Memorial Day and Labor Day.

### IT /Automation Team

The IT Team administers the primary recreation management software RecTrac, branded as ActiveMONTGOMERY, that facilitates customers activity registrations, facility reservations within recreation centers, and pass membership sales. Senior members of team provide regularly scheduled training classes and training materials to more than 250 career staff and over 500 part-time staff on navigating the software system regarding the processes for conducting transactions for recreational services. Rec IT works in close collaboration with the county's Finance Department to ensure financial interfaces and reconciliations are accurately integrated and reported daily to the county's financial systems.

In addition to RecTrac the team is responsible for Recreation's IT infrastructure, hardware, and software needs for all teams and facilities within the Department from procurement through install and end-user training. REC IT ensures the Department's practices regarding use of information systems and resources comply and align to the county's Administrative Procedures and information security best practices.

### **Youth Development**

Montgomery County Recreation's Youth Development Team uses a variety of means to reach the County's diverse young people. Our recreation activities and services allow children and teens to make the most of their time outside of school.

#### **Updates:**


- All Youth Development afterschool programs in partnership with MCPS continue to operate at 46 locations. Current enrollment is **7186** (an increase of 765 from December) and we continue to enroll new participants weekly. Staffing Currently still recruiting and interviewing to fill 4 career vacancies within the team (2 Rec Specialists for EBBE, 1 Rec Supervisor & 1 PAA for TeenWorks)
- -Special Programs Epic4Everyone snowboarding program launched 1/25 with 45 high school participants. Futsal programs (52 teams total) continue with attendance numbers of 300 at Wheaton CRC & 400 at Germantown CRC on Friday nights. Fashion Book Camp launched 1/26 with 61 enrolled (average attendance for two nights is 46 middle and high school participants). Teens Day Out held on 1/29 at 3 locations serving 62 middle schoolers on a trip to Main Event (Columbia, MD). Collaborating with Fire & Rescue to implement a week of activities 2/20-2/23
- -Elementary Programs- Winter programming session kicked off in January. Leleck EBBE has a team participating in the departments winter basketball league being coached by a parent (fulfilling his community service hours). They scored their first baskets in a game! New sites launched at Harriet Tubman & Watkins Mills ES with enrollment of 99 so far. Staff still onboarding new registrants and academic providers from MCPS.
- -Middle Programs- Session Two of EBBM kicked off on 1/30. RecXtra participants from Sligo MS participated in Councilmembers Town Hall at Wheaton on 1/29/24. Poms & Cheer participants at Rosa Parks MS have been performing during school basketball games. RecXtra at Takoma Park MS garden/horticulture club joined a plant sale providing the fruits and vegetables grown and harvested by students on Saturday, January 27<sup>th</sup> that had guests such as the principal and the mayor of Takoma Park come out to support
- -High School Programs- 17 new TeenWorks employees and 9 new Volunteers onboarded; 7 inclusion trainings held for volunteers; supported inclusion requests for Kids/Teens Day Out on 1/29 fulfilling 9 placements; 30 seasonal staff participated in the RecZone staff training held 1/5 at White Oak CRC; RecZones implemented e-scanning attendance tracking; Women & Girls in Sports day celebrated at Futsal on 2/2.
