

Looking to find a job in Recreation? Summer Leadership Challenge (SLC) Aquatics is specifically designed to prepare young people to obtain employment with Montgomery County Recreation as a Lifeguard, Swim Instructor or Pool Aide. The SLC Coaching and Officiating program is designed to provide employment opportunities with Recreation as a coach or official in youth basketball or flag football.

SUMMER LEADERSHIP CHALLENGE (Ages 13 - 16)

This leadership development program encourages exploration, independence and personal growth. Young people participate in interactive workshops and experiences that prepare them for leadership. Each session concludes with participants coordinating and implementing a capstone project benefiting the local community. Participants may earn up to 35 SSL hours for the session.

SUMMER LEADERSHIP CHALLENGE - AQUATICS (Ages 15 - 17)

Participants are introduced to skills necessary for employment as a swim instructor and certified lifeguard. Participants must have basic swimming ability, be prepared to swim daily, be comfortable in deep water and submerging under water to a depth of 6 feet. Instruction will focus on basic swim instruction principles and swimming for conditioning. Each program concludes with participants coordinating and implementing a capstone project benefiting the community. Participants who pass a water skills test will be offered free registration for lifeguard training courses at County aquatic facilities. Participants will also receive an opportunity to earn CPR and First Aid certification and be exposed to other aquatics water-based activities. Participants may earn up to 35 SSL hours for the session.

SUMMER LEADERSHIP CHALLENGE -**COACHING AND OFFICIATING** (Ages 14 - 17)

In this specialty program participants are introduced to skills necessary for employment in the sports field, particularly flag football. Young people will learn about non-athlete career paths in sports, flag football coaching and officiating guidelines, rules and techniques, in addition to establishing lasting friendships, working effectively in groups, building accountability and gaining confidence to solve problems independently. Each session concludes with participants coordinating and implementing a capstone project benefiting the community. In addition to developing useful skills, participants will earn up to 35 student service-learning (SSL) hours and receive individual leadership feedback. Participants will also receive an opportunity to earn CPR and First Aid certification and a micro credential in flag football officiating that can be used to work as an official in Montgomery County Recreation programs.
