Purpose: The purpose of this directive is to establish grooming standards for *Sheriff's Office*

employees.

Policy: It is the policy of this office that employees be well groomed and present a

professional appearance to maintain the public's trust and respect. Both the self-esteem generated in the individual and the respect commanded from the public

they serve promote the excellent reputation of the *O*ffice.

I. Hair Standards - Generally

Hair length could pose a deputy safety concern when dealing with inmates or arrestees; or when wearing protective equipment. The purpose of this directive is to put safeguards in place due to the potential for injury to the employee, when dealing with a potentially combative individual or using protective equipment. All deputies must conform to the following:

- A. All *employees* must wear *a* hairstyle that *projects a* neat and professional image.
- B. Hair must be clean and neatly groomed; the bulk of hair must not be excessive or present an unkempt or extreme appearance.
- C. The hairstyle must not interfere with the proper wearing of office *issued* headgear or the performance of assigned tasks and duties.
- D. No eccentricity in the color and style of hair will be permitted.
- E. Wigs or hairpieces may be worn as long as they conform to this directive.

II. Hair Standards for Male Deputies

A. Haircuts

Hair will not extend:

- (1) **B**eyond the mid-point of the ear; or
- (2) Extend below mid-point of the shirt collar in the rear.

B. Sideburns

- (1) The length of sideburns may extend below to a point straight and level with the lowest point of the ear lobe.
- (2) Sideburns are to be kept neatly trimmed at all times.

C. Facial Hair

- (1) Other than a mustache, facial hair is not permitted unless a deputy is being treated for a facial skin disorder that is exacerbated by shaving.
 - (a) A deputy requesting permission from the Sheriff to wear a beard must submit to the Sheriff a doctor's certification to forego shaving.
 - (b) If the Sheriff authorizes a beard, a full profile beard must be worn with a maximum hair length of 1/4 inch.
- Mustaches are permitted but must be neatly trimmed and must not extend more than 1/4 inch below or beyond the line of the individual's upper lip. The mustache will not connect with the sideburns. No eccentricity in the manner of the wearing of a mustache will be permitted.

III. Hair Standards for Female Deputies

If hair is long (natural length which is below the mid-point of their shirt collar), while in uniform it must be worn in a manner that prevents the hair from being below the midpoint of the shirt collar and presents a neat appearance.

IV. <u>Jewelry</u>

- A. Deputies must not wear eccentric, gaudy or costume jewelry.
- B. Necklaces or bracelets worn by uniform deputies must not be visible, except for Medic-Alert necklaces or bracelets.
- C. Facial jewelry is prohibited except for earrings.

D. Earrings

- (1) The wearing of earrings by male deputies is prohibited.
- (2) Female deputies may wear earrings subject to the following:
 - (a) They may wear one earring per ear, worn centered on the earlobe.
 - (b) Must not extend beyond the earlobe and must be of muted design.
 - (c) When worn, a symmetrically matching set must be worn.

V. Eyewear

The wearing of eccentric or faddish styles or frames of eyeglasses and/or sunglasses is prohibited.

VI. Tattoos, Piercings and Body Modifications

- A. Tattoos are permitted under the following provisions:
 - (1) Tattoos may not be visible on or above the neck.
 - (2) Tattoos may not be visible on any portion of the hands or fingers.
 - (3) Visible tattoos may not depict material that is:
 - (a) Racist, sexist, or homophobic.
 - (b) Sexually suggestive or explicit.
 - (c) Obscene or profane.
 - (d) Gang or drug related.
 - (e) Generally undermining to Sheriff's Office values and standards.

B. Piercings

Unless otherwise permitted by provisions of this directive, no piercings may be visible while an employee is on duty.

C. Body Modifications

Body modifications which are visible while on duty are prohibited. Prohibited body modifications do not include those procedures medically necessitated by illness, deformity, or injury, when performed by a licensed medical professional. Prohibited body modifications include, but are not limited to:

- (1) Tongue splitting or bifurcation.
- (2) Complete or trans-dermal implantation of any objects other than hair replacement.
- (3) Abnormal shaping of the ears, eyes, or nose.
- (4) Gauging or gradually increasing the radius of a surgically induced opening in the flesh in areas such as the ear lobes or lips; and
- (5) Branding or scarification.

VII. <u>Exceptions</u>

The Sheriff or Chief Deputy may authorize exceptions to the requirements of this written directive.

VIII. Cancellation

This written directive cancels and replaces General Orders/Personnel Procedures 2.18, effective 06/17/05.
