GENERAL OPERATIONAL PROCEDURES

Response to Medical Emergencies Within the Judicial Center	3.17	06/02/11

Purpose: This directive establishes procedures for responding to medical emergencies within the Judicial Center. A coordinated effort is essential to the well being of staff and visitors. (41.2.4, 73.2.1.c)

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I. <u>Deputies Responsibilities (41.2.4)</u>

In the event of a medical emergency within the Judicial Center deputies *must*:

- A. Render first aid to the sick *or* injured person.
- B. Notify the Court and Transport*ation* Section Supervisor, via radio, of the following information:
 - (1) The location of the sick *or* injured person;
 - (2) The nature of the illness or injury; and
 - (3) The need for *Montgomery County Fire and Rescue Service (MCFRS)* or additional deputies to respond to the medical emergency.
 - (a) If MCFRS is needed and there is a phone available, a deputy on the scene will call 911 to provide the needed information to the 911 dispatcher.
- C. If assigned courtroom duty, deputies must:
 - (1) Secure any prisoners in the courtroom holding cell before taking any action.
 - (2) Secure, if feasible, sick or injured prisoners who cannot be moved to a holding cell due to the nature of the sickness *or* injury.

(3) Transport any sick *or* injured prisoner requiring hospitalization according to *General Operational Procedure 3.02*, Custody and Transporting Prisoners.

II. <u>Supervisors Responsibilities</u>

Upon notification of a medical emergency within the Judicial Center, *a* Court and Transportation *Section* Supervisor *must*:

- A. Assign deputies to respond to the location with a first aid kit *or other medical equipment as needed.*
 - (1) A defibrillator is located on the lobby level at the Monroe Street security station.
 - (2) Elevator override keys are located in the security monitor room and in the Court and Transportation section. (73.2.1.b)
- B. If *needed*, notify *MCFRS* and assign a *Courthouse Security* deputy, with an elevator over-ride key, to the lobby area of the Judicial Center to escort *MCFRS* personnel to the scene of the medical emergency.
- C. Notify the *Sheriff and Chief Deputy* of the incident *through the chain of command. (11.4.5)*
- D. *Assign* the senior ranking deputy on the scene of the medical emergency to complete an Incident Report (MCSO9) prior to the end of their tour of duty.
