MCPD Public Safety Update:

- Crime Suppression Task Force -
 - Reformed District Community Action Team (DCAT)
 - Made up of 7 officers from around the county
 - Up and running and taken over for the Crime Suppression Task Force
 - 7 guns off the road
- 71 Ghost Guns seized this guarter county wide, 79 all of last year
- Staffing issues continue
 - Involuntary Holdovers
 - If shifts are short they ask for volunteers county wide
 - If there are not enough, they move to involuntary holdovers based on seniority.
 - Described as doing more with less
- More license plate readers enroute.
 - Often people committing crimes are using stolen vehicles from other areas and coming into Silver Spring
 - o (Jay) Will they be able to detect obscured tags?
 - No but will say not-readable, and that is citation
- CBD Alcohol compliance checks in the early hours of the morning.
 - Easter Sunday fight at 6am that was moved into the street.
 - o General compliance at 10, 11, midnight
- Cars with suspended tags
- Automated Traffic Enforcement Unit moved camera from near the dog park on Colesville. Moved to try and catch people out.

- Actions During Pandemic to Preserve PLD Fiscal Health
 - Hiring Freeze
 - Operating Expenditure Savings Plan (26% Reduction)
 - Maintained pre-pandemic UD Transfers
 - Capital Improvements Freeze (Emergencies only 72% Reduction)
- Fiscal Challenges Moving Forward
 - Labor/Service Contract Costs
 - Construction/Materials/Parts Costs
 - Inflationary Environment
 - Supply-Chain Concerns
- Garage Occupancy still down 10-15% but on an upward trajectory affected by new variants
- Even if occupancy is coming up, Demand is different
 - Peak time is spread out
 - More on nights and weekends (When they don't charge)
 - Revenues have not recovered as much as occupancy
- Security schedule rotates but they're contract security. They aren't armed
- If they do not add Saturday rates in 2024 they will not be able to

- maintain a balanced budget
- Return to Office will help with revenue
- Silver Spring Garages do not have any debt in them
- Once third shift of enforcement is in place, there will be enforcement of no parking areas outside of garages as well (IE: Mayor's Lane)
- PLD does not do towing. Towing is centrally done through the MCPD
