- 1. Welcome and Introductions: Chair DeAndre Morrow led self-introductions of attendees.
- 2. September Meeting Summary Approved
- 3. Public Safety Report: Battalion Chief Mark Davis distributed a list of incidents the 1<sup>st</sup> District station responded to in the third quarter and provided an update on activities.
  - 1<sup>st</sup> District is the busiest station in Silver Spring.
  - Week of 10/9 is fire prevention week. They are doing a lot of public outreach this month.
- 4. Election Board Dialogue and Demonstration: Gilbert Zelaya, Outreach and Early Voting Coordinator, described the voting process and demonstrated use of new optical scanners.
  - 670,000 Registered voters in Montgomery County- 51% live in Silver Spring
  - Of 900 voting centers in the state, the Civic Center is usually the first or second busiest.
  - "Do More than Vote" program provides training for election judges.
  - Section 203 of the Voting Rights Act requires bi-lingual ballots for areas where more than 5 percent of the total voting age citizens are members of a single minority language group.
  - Early Voting period is 10/27-11/3 from 8 am to 8 pm.
- 5. SSCAB Committee Updates: September meetings were a joint session on Master Planning Process.
  - Neighborhood: County Council's PHED committee is holding its fifth work session on 10/24 to review the Renter Protection Bill. Mark Elrich is the main sponsor and will update community at upcoming Neighborhood Committee meeting.
  - CED and TREE are planning meeting with Dan Hoffman, head of County's Innovation Program.
- 6. Board Chair's Report: DeAndre Morrow noted he will draft a letter to summarize the September's Master Planning meetings as potential letter to council and county executive.
  - November's SSCAB meeting will address the achievement gap in Montgomery County schools.
  - Silver Spring Thanksgiving Day Parade on Nov 19 will serve as the board's joint committee event. Invited attendees to march with SSCAB. Ed Levy to organize.
  - Asked members to submit updated Bios for SSCAB web page.

- 7. Regional Area Director's Report: Reemberto Rodriguez, noting many 'new' faces in attendance, outlined the areas represented by this regional area and referred to the community issues listed in the evening's handout.
  - Community raised almost \$750K for victims of the Flower Branch fire- 58 households in 26 apartments.
  - Despite current law suits, Purple Line is on-schedule.
  - Planning for BRT for Route 29 continues with advisory meetings every 3 months.
- 8. Councilmember Updates: Dave Asche, Legislative Aide for Tom Hucker, provided an update.
  - Tom and T&E (Transportation, Infrastructure, Energy & Environment) committee is meeting on 10/27 to review new digital residential parking permit program.
  - Tom has sponsored the Urban Farming Tax credit for properties on less than 5 acres.
- 9. New Business: Reemberto Rodriguez asked attendees if there was an interest in a Purple Line update for the community. Response was positive. SSCAB's last transportation focused meeting was November of 2015.
