The Domestic Violence Coordinating Council, in partnership with Montgomery County Public Schools, is hosting the free conference that will address teen dating and ways to establish healthy relationships. It is for 6th through 12th grade students, parents, youth service providers, educators and others. One in three adolescents in the U.S. is a victim of physical, sexual, emotional or verbal abuse from a dating partner, a figure that far exceeds rates of other types of youth violence. Conference attendees will learn about various ways to end the cycle of dating violence.

At the beginning of the Choose Respect Conference, there will be a resource fair with community organizations as well as live music and a red carpet where attendees can take selfies with DJs from iHeart Radio stations. Toby Knapp of iHeart Radio 97.1, will emcee the opening ceremony. Winners will be announced for the annual Choose Respect PSA Contest and raffle prizes.

MDOT-SHA Seeks Input for I-495 and I-270 Managed Lanes Study at Public Open Houses in April in Montgomery and Prince Georges Counties

Citizens Encouraged to Attend Mid-April Evening Meetings in Upper Marlboro, Clarksburg, Bethesda and Greenbelt

The Maryland Department of Transportation State Highway Administration (MDOT SHA) will hold four public open houses in April for the I-495 and I-270 Managed Lanes Study, which is the first step for public input on the Traffic Relief Plan to reduce congestion on two of the state's most heavily traveled highways. The National Capital region is one of the most congested in the nation with some of the highest commuting times.

MDOT SHA, in conjunction with the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA), will prepare an Environmental Impact Statement for the I-495 and I-270 Managed Lanes Study to identify innovative transportation solutions to reduce congestion.

The study considers improvements along the entire length of I-495 (Capital Beltway) in Maryland, as well as the entire length of I-270 (Dwight D. Eisenhower Memorial Highway) up to I-70 in Frederick County, Maryland. The I-495 and I-270 Managed Lanes Study extends along I-495 from south of the American Legion Bridge in Virginia to east of the Woodrow Wilson Bridge and on I-270 from I-495 to I-370, including the east and west spurs. The study will include a review of existing and future traffic, existing roadway infrastructure, and environmental conditions to identify alternatives and assess potential impacts.

The four public open houses will solicit public input regarding the scope of the study, including the purpose and need, potential alternatives to be considered, and environmental impacts to be evaluated. The open house dates and locations are as follows:

MCDOT Partnership with Public Schools Featured at Leggett's Launch of "Stay Alert, Stay Alive" Awareness and Enforcement Campaign



The National Safety Council has designated the month of April as Distracted Driving Awareness month. To promote safety, Montgomery County Executive Ike Leggett launched the "Stay Alert, Stay Alive" awareness and enforcement campaign to curb distracted driving and distracted walking. The campaign includes the Montgomery County Department of Transportation (MCDOT) and Montgomery County Public Schools (MCPS) collaboration during Teen Pedestrian Safety Week, April 23 to 27, to reduce collisions resulting from distracted driving and walking. During the last five years, drivers have hit at least 292 teen pedestrians in Montgomery County, and five of those teens died. In addition to promoting safety through education, MCDOT also makes traffic engineering improvements throughout the County, including the types of safety-related enhancements recently completed or underway in the North Wheaton community where Leggett made his announcement near Wheaton High School.

The "Stay Alert, Stay Alive" campaign is part of Montgomery County's Vision Zero initiative to reduce severe and fatal collisions among vehicle occupants, bicyclists and pedestrians. Montgomery County Law Enforcement Agencies and DHHS to Participate in DEA Nationwide Prescription Drug Take-Back Day; An Opportunity to Help Prevent Opioid Abuse by Safe Disposal of Unused Opioid Prescriptions

Community members can drop off unused, unwanted, or expired prescription drugs, as Montgomery County once again participates in the Washington Division of the Drug Enforcement Administration's (DEA's) National Prescription Drug Take-Back Day. County law enforcement agencies and the Montgomery County Department of Health and Human Services Substance Abuse Prevention Office are co-sponsoring the effort. This is a safe, free and anonymous opportunity to dispose of unused, unwanted or expired prescription drugs and is part of a national effort to prevent the increasing problems of prescription drug abuse and theft that continues to occur nationwide.

Drop-off locations will be open to the public throughout Montgomery County. These locations will accept prescription drugs and over-the-counter medications only. Liquids, illicit drugs, needles, sharps and syringes cannot be accepted as part of this take-back program. Assistant Chief Luther Reynolds Retiring with 29 Years of Dedicated Service; Beginning New Role as Charleston South Carolina's Police Chief



On April 9, 2018, Montgomery County Police Assistant Chief Luther Reynolds completed his last tour of duty after 29 years of service with the Montgomery County Police Department. He will become the City of Charleston (South Carolina) Police Department's new Police Chief on April 16.

Assistant Chief Reynolds grew up in Gaithersburg and attended Seneca Valley High School. Upon graduating from Florida State University in 1988, Luther Reynolds was hired by the Department as a civilian employee handling budgets and planning and policy issues. He entered the police academy in August of 1989.

His first assignment was as a patrol officer in the 5th Police District, which at that time combined coverage of both the Gaithersburg and Germantown areas. Reynolds rose through the ranks from Patrol Officer to Sergeant, Lieutenant, Captain/Commander, to Assistant Chief. Through the years, he has served in many positions to include Deputy Director of the 4th District, Commander of the 2nd District and 5th District, Director of the Personnel Division, Director of the Training and Education Division, and Director of the Special Operations Division. Since his appointment to an Assistant Chief in 2013, he has served as Chief of two bureaus: the Management Services Bureau and the Patrol Services Bureau.

Assistant Chief Darryl McSwain Retires from the Montgomery County Department of Police to Become Chief of Maryland-National Capital Park Police – Montgomery County Division



Montgomery County Department of Police Assistant Chief Darryl McSwain is retiring from the department to accept a new appointment as Chief of the Maryland-National Capital Park Police – Montgomery County Division. He will assume his new law enforcement leadership role on May 7, 2018.

Assistant Chief McSwain joined the department in 1988 and completes 30 years of service, retiring from his current position as the Chief of the Field Services Bureau. That position oversees the Animal Services Division, the District Court Liaison, Public Information Office, Security Services Division, Special Operations Division, the Crisis Support and Response Division, and the Traffic Division.

He will assume his new law enforcement leadership role on May 7, 2018.
