Individuals and groups are invited to provide input into the County's next six-year capital construction budget by attending public forums that are being held in June/July by local citizen advisory boards. The forums will help define construction and planning priorities for the various regions in the County as officials develop the Fiscal Years 2019 to 2024 Capital Improvements Program (CIP) budget. The Montgomery County Public Libraries (MCPL) Summer Read and Learn Program began on June 10. This year's theme is "Build a Better World". Children and teens are invited to sign up online or at any branch starting on June 10 through September 10.

The program offers children exciting reading and educational activities. Participants can earn online badges and prizes (while supplies last) or raffle entries for completing tracks. Project SEARCH Class of 2017

Initiated by Montgomery County Executive Ike Leggett in 2012, [Project SEARCH](#) provides young adults with developmental disabilities the opportunity to do unpaid internships with County government in order to develop knowledge and work skills that will lead to paid employment. Seventy percent of Montgomery County's program graduates have found paid employment, which is well above the national average. The combined, annual earning potential of all Project SEARCH graduates is an average of \$650,000. Incidentally, this results in an average, Social Security savings to taxpayers of \$300,000 a year. Montgomery County Council Seeks Applicants for Re-established Airpark Liaison Committee

The Montgomery County Council is seeking applicants to fill positions on the Montgomery County Airpark Liaison Committee. The Council authorized the re-establishment of the committee on June 13.

The committee was established to provide a forum for increased communication among interested groups and individuals concerned with the operations of the Montgomery County Airpark.

Applicants are being sought for the following seats on the committee:

- Seven residential neighborhood representatives: two from Montgomery Village East and five from other neighborhoods surrounding the Airpark.
- Two business representatives: one from inside the Airpark and one from outside the Airpark.
- One Upcounty Citizens Advisory Board representative.
- Two Airpark users.

In addition, the Council will appoint two Montgomery County Revenue Authority representatives, including the designated Airpark manager, and one representative from each of the following: the Montgomery County Executive, the County Council, the County Planning Department and an Airpark lease holder.
