#### Executive Summary

The Montgomery County Volunteer Center celebrated the 31<sup>st</sup> annual Community Service Week on October 21<sup>st</sup> through October 28<sup>th</sup>. Community Service Week is an opportunity to shine the spotlight on the organizations and causes that work to help sustain culture, community, and civic engagement in our county. **1,952 volunteers** provided **9,277 hours** supporting over **60 service projects** throughout the week. Projects ranged from building computers, to neighborhood cleanups, to feeding the homeless, and so much more to make Montgomery County a great place to live, work, and play.

### Project Snapshot

#### **Comfort Cases**

Comfort Cases provides children in the foster care system across the country with a small duffel bag or backpack with a purpose to provide comfort for youth as they enter the foster care system. The case provides the essentials for the first few days in a new place as well as comfort items to help ease a scary transition. These items include toiletries, books, blankets, school supplies, toys, and pajamas.

To date, Comfort Cases has served over 40,000 youth. In 2017 alone, they provided over 11,000 cases to children in 32 states.

During the 2018 Community Service Week, Comfort Cases partnered with the County Executive's office to bundle over 200 pajamas and assemble 30 backpacks.





#### Project Snapshot

#### Meals on Wheels of Takoma Park

Since 1954, Meals on Wheels of America aims to meet the nutritional and social needs of seniors across the county. It supports our senior neighbors to extend their independence and health as they age. What started as a compassionate idea has grown into one of the largest and most effective social movements in America, currently helping nearly 2.4 million seniors annually in virtually every community in the country.

Meals on Wheels of Takoma Park, a chapter of Meals on Wheels of America, delivers meals to anyone in Takoma Park who has physical difficulty preparing meals or going grocery shopping on a regular basis. For Community Service Week, 95 volunteers cleaned up and decorated their center's volunteer welcome area.





### Project Snapshot

#### **Phoenix Computers**

Phoenix Computers<sup>™</sup> is an all-volunteer organization whose mission is to empower low income families, disabled individuals, schools, nonprofits, religious-based institutions, and charities by providing low-cost refurbished computers. Phoenix collects donated new and used computers, equipment, and software. Once refurbished, they are sold to those in need at a low cost.

Phoenix Computers launched in 1995 by Gerry Rosenkratz who began refurbishing computers for the Legal Aid Bureau, then quickly expanded the operation to provide computers to Montgomery County schools. Since then, Phoenix Computers has grown to a group of 20 volunteers who have provided computers and equipment to over 10,000 clients.





#### Project Snapshot

#### Girls on the Run

Girls on the Run (GOTR) is dedicated to creating a world where every girl knows and activates her limitless potential and is free to boldly pursue her dreams. GOTR Montgomery County serves nearly 5,000 girls each year with the support of approximately 600 coaches each season. Over the past ten years, they have served more than 25,000 girls and have provided over \$1 million in financial assistance to families in need.

Running is used to inspire and motivate girls, encourage lifelong health and fitness, and build confidence through accomplishment. Volunteers gathered this week to prepare race bibs and medals for the annual fall 5K race held on November 18<sup>th</sup>.




## World of Montgomery Festival

The Volunteer Center participated in the 10<sup>th</sup> Annual World of Montgomery Festival on October 21<sup>st</sup> to promote volunteerism and service throughout the County and drive awareness and participation in Community Service Week. With 6,000 in attendance and **210 volunteers** supporting this cultural event, the team had over **350 interactions** with event attendees and distributed an estimated **200 event flyers**.
